Tomorrow, at 3:30, John Nesbitt will tell a special Christmas story about a window dresser who didn't believe in Christmas. Then Mutual-Don Lee's "Great Scenes From Great Plays" Friday night will deviate from its normal programming procedure for its Christmas Eve broadcast, when it features an all-musical program of Christmas songs and carols with Gladys Swarthout and Lawrence Tibbett as the singing stars. A mixed-voice a cappella choir and an augmented orchestra, under the direction of Nathan Kroll, will support Miss Swarthout and Mr. Tibbett. At 7:30, Dr. John W. Gregory, prominent clinical psychologist and member of the faculty of a Los Angeles university, will be a "Christmas present" to the girls on "Leave It to the Girls." He'll face the barbed-word barages hurled by career women on the regular panel.

At 8 Friday night, the University of Redland "Messiah" concert will be presented as a special Christmas feature. At 10 p. m., a full hour Christmas concert with an orchestra and chorus will be heard under the title: "This Holy Night." How's that for Christmas Eve listening enjoyment?

Will touch lightly on Christmas Day's special features—but of necessity, details will be forthcoming. At 10:30 a. m. Saturday, "Christmas Morning, By Request," will replace "Telephone Request" this one time only; at 11:45 a. m., the North-South football game from Montgomery, Ala., will be aired; 4 to 5 p. m., the traditional "Joyful Hour;" and 9:30 to 10:30 p. m., it's the "Christmas Cavalcade," with Fibber Magee and Molly—plus Dickens' "Christmas Carol."
