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Republican Joins Move To Restore Farm Props

WASHINGTON, Dec. 24.—(AP)—A Midwestern Republican joined a Dixie Democrat yesterday in a move to jack back up the farm price props which were lowered by the 80th Congress.

Rep. Jensen (R-Iowa) said he will offer a bill to repeal the 60 to 90 per cent sliding supports provided in the new farm law and keep the props under basic crops at a flat 90 per cent of parity as at present.

Earlier, Rep. Cooley (D-N.C.), who is slated to head the House agriculture committee in January, predicted the law will be amended. He told reporters the
