KRNR DIAL-LOG

Would like to devote this space today to a few notes of interest regarding the Cotton Bowl game to be aired New Year's Day over KRNR—11 a. m. to conclusion. May-be you'd like to know a bit about Oregon's football coach, Jim Aiken...

Jim, who in two years at Oregon has pulled the Ducks into top contender position in the Pacific Coast Conference championship race, is a veteran in the coaching field. He started his career in 1922 after graduation from Washington and Jefferson. After a string of victories with Ohio high school teams he broke into collegiate football ranks at Akron University in 1936 where he stayed for three years to win 20 games, lose six and tie one. Then he went on to Nevada for an eight-year stay, which resulted in the development of the Wolfpack into one of the top independent teams in the country.

In 1947, with the Oregon Ducks wobbling at the bottom of the Pacific Conference ladder, Jim Aiken was brought in to boost them up the ladder. 1948 has found the Ducks unbeaten, untied in conference play—with only one defeat, and that at the hands of mighty Michigan State. He believes in wide open football with an abundance of passing. To make this attack effective, he spends countless hours on pass protection. It pays off. Last season, Norm Van Brocklin passed 178 times, punted 66 times. On only two plays did the line fail to afford enough protection for him to get his pass away.

The Aiken method of coaching is paying off for Oregon as it moves into its first bowl game competition against Southern Methodist University at the Cotton Bowl on New Year's Day, 1949. The Cotton Bowl game will be broadcast over Mutual and KRNR starting at 11 a. m.

Atty. Gen. of California Target of Recall Move

SAN FRANCISCO, Dec. 29—(AP)—A movement intended to oust California Attorney General Fred N. Howser was started yesterday by two San Francisco attorneys.

A letter proposing Howser's recall was circulated to all peace officers and law enforcement agents; and political and civic groups by James F. Brennan, Republican and former assistant district attorney, and Morris M. Grupp, a Democrat.

(In Los Angeles, Howser said he had no comment to make on the movement "now or at any future time.")

The letter based the proposed recall on recent gambling

furors which culminated in the Mendocino County slot machine racket trials. Wiley (Jack) Caddel, former undercover agent for Howser, and two other defendants were convicted on charges of bribing Sheriff Beverly Broadus of Mendocino County in an alleged attempt to organize slot machine operations under "protection" of the attorney general's office.
