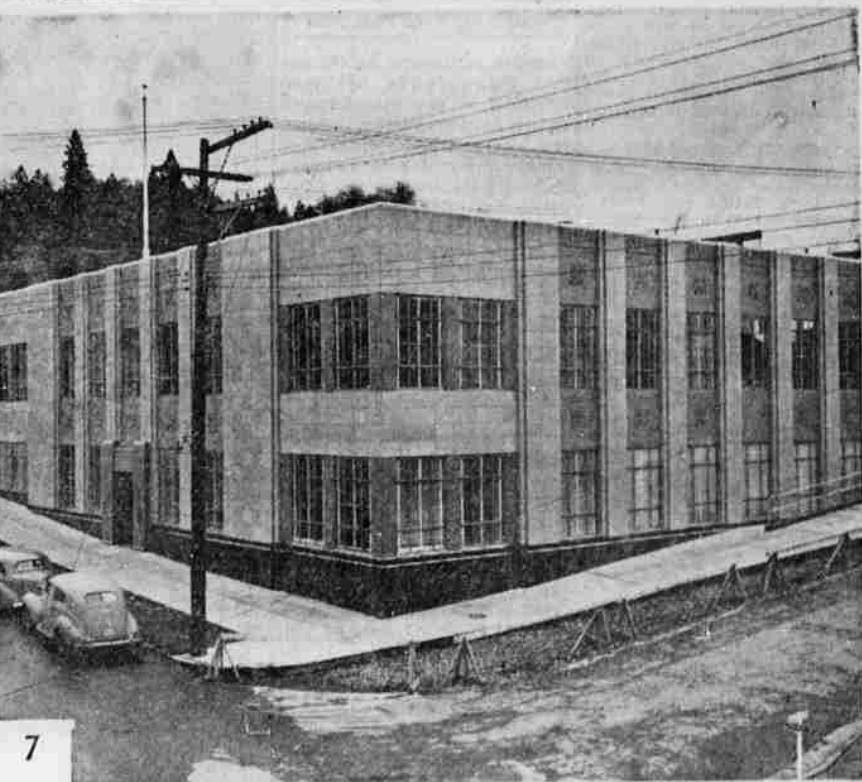
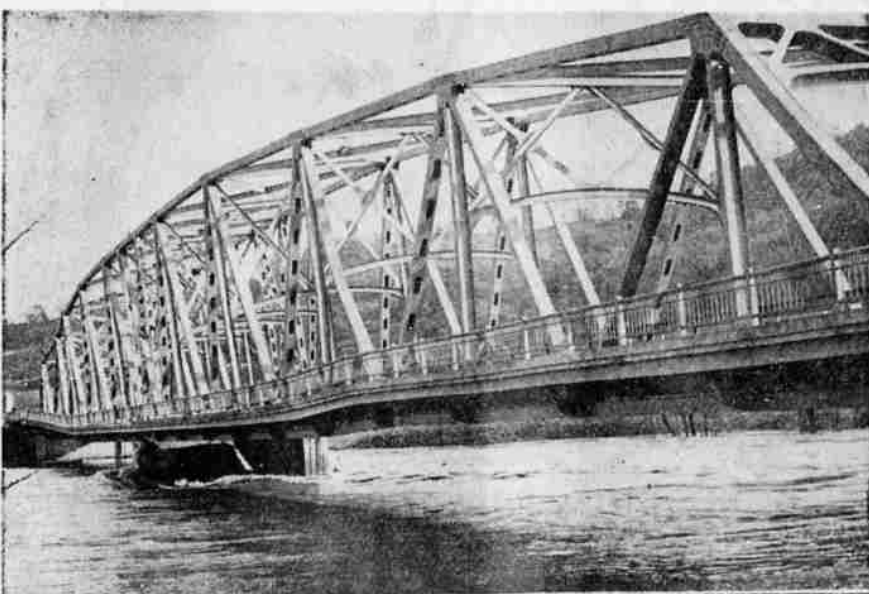

Pictorial highlights of the past year's pageant of events in Roseburg and Douglas County are pictured on this page. They include:

(1) A major fire disaster destroying the Roseburg Lumber Co. dry kilns, green chain and 1,300,000 feet of stored lumber, last May 22. (2) Murder trial of Francis Stanley White, right, for fatal beating, robbery of 80-year-old Willis Moffitt Aug. 13. He and alleged accomplice, Claude Moser, left, are serving life terms in penitentiary. (3) Flood, which cracked center pier of the Pacific Highway bridge over South Umpqua River, south of Dillard, causing bridge to sag; rampaging waters forcing tent dwellers at Myrtle Creek to evacuate, seek Red Cross flood disaster aid. (4) Selection of Mrs. S. L. (Maude Rast) Kidder as Oregon Mother of 1948. (5) Start and completion this summer of municipal swimming pool on Rose School grounds, after many years of "talk." (6) Selection of Bill Black as First Junior Citizen by the Roseburg Junior Chamber of Commerce, for his outstanding work with Knights of Pythias Girls Drum Corps. (7) Industrial progress, with completion of \$400,000 dial exchange building and co-axial cable center of Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Co. (8) Triple-blessing of A. R. Coble home, with birth of triplets Oct. 15 at Mercy Hospital. (9) Festival honors at Portland for Lorraine Losee, outstanding drum majorette of Pacific Northwest high school bands. (10) Shooting of George M. Denton, aged groceryman, July 10 and sentence of his attacker, William Kenneth Downs, to 25 years in the penitentiary. (11) Another Sutherland girl named as Miss Roseburg, Joyce Shiffel, who represented Lions Club in contest at Seaside, Ore. (12) Catch of the largest Chinook salmon in Oregon in several years; J. H. Herrington pictured here with his 50-pounder, caught May 2 at "the Forks." (13) Judging of 18-year-old Dixie Emerson, brunette Oakland lass, as queen of the 4th annual Douglas County Sheriff's Posse Rodeo.
