

Northwestern's Win Over Bears in Rose Bowl Clouded By Dispute Over Touchdown

SADENA, Calif., Jan. 3.—(AP)—It's been chilly in these parts, but arguments over Art Murakowski's touchdown for Northwestern in the Rose Bowl are warming up the whole landscape today.

These arguments are, of course, unofficial, but for the fans' hot love there's fuel aplenty for a whole long winter; maybe many winters.

Officially, that score board still says Northwestern 20, California 14. That's the way it'll stay.

The heated discussion centers around what fullback Murakowski did or didn't do, the newspaper pictures thereof, the telecasts and what the fans saw, or thought they saw, especially California rooters.

Murakowski fumbled, and they will argue from here to there on whether he fumbled an instant before or after he crossed the CAL goal line. The officials ruled it a touchdown on the ground he had possession of the ball crossing the final white line, then fumbled. That made the score 13 to 7 for Northwestern. If the decision had been that Murakowski fumbled before cross-

ing the line, the score would have stayed at 7-7 at the moment and recovery of the loose ball in the end zone by California's Will Lotter would have given the Bears the ball on their own 20-yard line.

Several newspaper pictures seem to indicate that Murakowski fumbled before he got to the goal line, but even some headlines concede that camera angles are deceptive.

What everyone does agree upon is that the thriller before a sellout 92,500 crowd was one of the best Rose Bowl games in many years.

Northwestern's Frank Aschenbrenner started the ground-hugging scoring parade Saturday with a 75-yard first quarter gallop. A couple of plays later California's Jack Jensen went 67 yards to tie the score.

Tom Worthing's 38-yard punt return set up the much-discussed Murakowski score which gave Northwestern a 13-7 halftime lead.

Jack Swanner put the Bears ahead 14-13 in the third quarter by going over from the four-

Wahlberg Defeats Rufus Jones; Hager Conquers Kneilson

Whitey Wahlberg, the husky Norwegian from Minnesota, won two out of three falls over Rufus Jones, Detroit Negro, and Tex Hager, coast light-heavy champ, beat Stocky Kneilson, Tennessee hillbilly villain, in Elton Owen's double main event program New Year's night in the armory.

A relatively small crowd turned out for the performances probably because of the snow, earlier in the evening or possibly because too many people had done too much celebrating the night before.

In the final match Wahlberg twice pulled fast ones to take the measure of head-butting Rufus, after losing the first fall from a series of head-butts and a Boston crab, applied by Jones. The bout opened mildly and the husky Negro seemed to be able to do about what he pleased with Wahlberg. However, the well-built Norwegian matched the other's skill with his brute strength and ability to take punishment.

Rufus mated out plenty of punishment with leg scissors holds, and then the rough stuff started when Wahlberg retaliated from some dirty work from Jones with jiu jitsu tactics of his own. The bout continued rough, and Rufus managed to head-butt Wahlberg into submission to apply his Boston crab after 14.1 minutes.

The second round went about the same as the first, but had a surprise ending. When it looked as though the Negro had again succeeded in head-butting Wahlberg silly and was in the process of turning the latter over for another Boston crab, Whitey gave a quick flip and ended up on top of Rufus to pin his shoulders for a three-count in five minutes, 14 seconds.

The third round was over in six minutes, seven seconds, when Wahlberg successfully downed Jones with a series of shoulder-butts and droppings, then fell on him for a body press. When the bout was over Jones protested that he had not been pinned for the count, and struck Referee Buck Davidson from behind as the latter was leaving the ring. Davidson retaliated with a few well placed blows and the unscheduled bout ended promptly.

Hager Pins Kneilson
The Hager-Kneilson bout also mixed a cleanie with a meanie, and to prove that crime doesn't pay, the cleanie won in the final round. The popular Tex proved capable of handling himself in good style against his bewhiskered Tennessee foe.

The first fall went to the champ, whose title was not at stake, after 16 minutes on a double leg lock. Kneilson came back to take the second fall after

after an 85-yard California march. The Wildcat's winning punch, a 43-yard scoring run by Ed Tunnell, ended an 88-yard drive with less than three minutes left in the game.

14 and a half minutes, when he managed to pound Tex into submission by thumping him against the ropes and battering him with his knee.

The final fall was a quickie. Kneilson opened the round by continuing his same tactics, but Tex, not to be outdone, bounced the meanie to the mat with a series of drop kicks and a body press after only 59 seconds.

SMU Defeats Oregon, 21-13, In Cotton Bowl Tilt

Dallas, Tex., Jan. 3.—(AP)—Oregon's Webfoots go home today disappointed with the score in the Cotton Bowl, where they lost to Southern Methodist 21-13, but with the athletic officials feeling very good, thank you, because of a check for \$108,912.47.

Coch Matty Bell of Southern Methodist said the Cotton Bowl game was one of the finest the post-season classic ever has known. "Southern Methodist played its best game of the season," he commented. "We met a fine team—one that could have easily beaten us had we not been right. Oregon's team was a fine group of sportsmen, and we were proud to have played them."

Penalties Hurt Oregon
The Webfoots had three drives stopped on them by penalties, dropped several passes that might have set up scores and were on the move, but, once getting to the Southern Methodist six-yard line only to be halted. They showed a never-say-die spirit by coming back to make two touchdowns in the last quarter, one of them against SMU reserves. Bell explained that he put in the second stringers "because there were some seniors I thought deserved the right to play in the last game."

Southern Methodist, in addition to its scoring drives, reached Oregon's 28, 13 and 16-yard lines in other plays. The penalty tally was called against SMU and it didn't hurt. It set the Mustangs back to the Oregon eight-yard line but the Mustangs scored anyway.

Van Brocklin, who made a 16-yard gain on the last play of the game, said it was the first time he could remember carrying the ball all season. He was used only as a quarterback, passer and punter by Oregon. Brad Ecklund, Oregon's terrific center who finished his career in the Cotton Bowl, said he was going to play pro football with the New York Yanks.
