Truman Message Draws GOP Urge For Less Spending

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—(AP)—Congressional Republicans countered President Truman's plea for \$4,000,000,000 in new taxes yesterday with a demand for government economy.

Senator Taft of Ohio, chairman of the Republican Policy Committee, said: "While I agree that it is essential to balance the budget, I believe expenditures can be cut so that no tax increase will be necessary."

There were some differences among Democrats over the way any new taxes should be levied and southern legislators quickly raised the threat of a fight against the president's civil rights program.

But Senator Lucas of Illinois, who will be GOP leader for Senate Democrats, summed up the general reaction among party members in describing the president's program as "one designed to meet the needs of the great majority in this country."

Rep. Reed of New York put it in the philosophy of "tax and spend, tax and spend, elect and elect."

The president's request for repeal of the Taft-Hartley act and revival of a modified version of the Wagner act brought this comment from Taft:

"As soon as they open the door for changes, then we can try to shove in some other things."

Rep. Martin of Massachusetts, House Republican leader, said: "The president has recommended that every body expected he would, that Congress shall provide many billions of dollars to pay for his campaign promises."

If the Democratic congress agrees to his request in full, the country is in for some dizzy days."

Other comment included: Rep. Jackson (D-Wash): "The president's program is... a broad and liberal plan for legislation and it is my intention to support it."
