**Hungarian Govt. Will Pay Priests**

VATICAN CITY, Jan. 7.—(AP)—Vatican sources said today Hungary has decided that all Catholic clergy in that Communist-controlled country henceforth will receive their pay from the government.

The sources said this information was brought here through Msgr. Giulio Czapiek, archbishop of Eger, Czechoslovakia.

The information is that the decision was made by Hungary since the nationalization of Catholic schools, a move fought bitterly by the Catholic primate, Mindszenty the Cardinal. The cardinal now is under arrest on government charges of treason.

The payments to the priests are guaranteed only for the first six months of 1949, made directly by the state economic office rather than through church authorities as is customary, the informants said.

The first 12 hours of instructions will be regarded as a regular daily priestly assignment and extra payment will begin thereafter upon presentation of a certificate from the school director involved, the informants added.

**New Trial Starts In 'Kiss of Death' Case**

NEVADA CITY, Calif., Jan. 7.—(AP)—The second murder trial of Mrs. Lois Hunt Hardy opened today. She was sentenced to death a year ago for the "kiss of death" killing of a California motorist.

The State Supreme Court ordered the new trial of the 22-year-old, three married Mrs. Hardy because of prosecution errors in the first trial.


Mrs. Hardy and her common-law husband, Joseph L. Hardy, 24, of North Kittery, Maine, were convicted in separate trials of the slaying of James W. McLain, 48, of San Fernando. Hardy was sentenced to life imprisonment.

The Hardys were hitchhiking when McLain picked them up. They were accused of shooting him near Truckee after luring him there on promise of sexual relations with the woman.

**Rail Freight Rates Hike Goes Into Effect Jan. 11**

WASHINGTON, Jan. 7.—(AP)—The newly authorized "emergency" increases in railroad freight rates will go into effect next Tuesday, Jan. 11.

The railroads have completed revising the tariff schedules on file with the Interstate Commerce Commission and set that date to begin making the higher charges.

Many, but not all, of the domestic water carriers which received the same rate-hike authority from the commission on Dec. 30, have also filed new schedules effective on Tuesday.

The increases will amount to 6 per cent east of the Mississippi River and 4 per cent west of the river, except in zone 1 of western territory (most of Wisconsin, Iowa and Missouri) where a 5 per cent advance will be applied.
