

Support of Wool Prices Again Set

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Agriculture Department announced it will support grower prices of wool in 1949 at a national average of 42 cents a pound, grease basis.

This is approximately the same average as the 1948 support program.

Prices will be supported by government purchases.

As was the case this year, the purchase program will be operated under agreements with private trading handlers who will act as buying and selling agents of the government.

The department said, however, that some changes will be made in buying prices of certain grades and types of shorn and pulled wool.

In general, lower prices will be set for the least desirable types and increases for the more desirable market types.

The government has been supporting wool prices since 1943. In that period it has bought 1,539,428,000 pounds of wool, and sold all but about 142,000,000 pounds.

Azalea Rancher Acquires Top Grade Holstein Cow

BRATTLEBORO, Vt., Jan. 10. — (AP) — R. C. Head, Azalea, Oregon, recently acquired a registered Holstein-Friesian cow from the herd of Barber Bros., New Haven, Oregon.

Change of ownership for this cow, Alderale Leona Perfection, has been officially recorded here by the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

The Association issued 951 registry and transfer certificates to Oregon breeders during 1947.

Northwest Population May Outstrip Food Crops

PORTLAND, Jan. 10. — (AP) — Population growth in the Pacific northwest may one day outstrip the region's ability to raise enough food for its own use.

Col. R. F. Bessey, chairman of the Department of the Interior's Northwest Field Committee made this surmise in addressing the Portland chapter of the Soil Conservation Society of America.

He compared the problem with that of Europe. He said that continent no longer grows enough food for all its people.

Bessey noted the northwest has grown from 1,000,000 population in 1900 to 4,750,000. He predicted the 1960 census would reach between 5,500,000 and 6,000,000.

He suggested greater use of crop land and warned that lumber use is double the annual growth.

West Coast Shipyards Ask Share of Building

WASHINGTON, Jan. 8. — (AP) — A plea that West Coast shipyards be given their share of government shipbuilding work will be carried directly to President Truman.

West Coast House members yesterday named Rep. Welch (R-Calif.) to head a nine-man committee which will confer with the President on problems of shipbuilders in their area.

Their aim, said Rep. Angell (R-Ore.) after the meeting, is to keep Pacific Coast yards ready to handle any work needed in the event of a national emergency.
