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Russia Promises To Return Cruiser

WASHINGTON, Jan. 11.—(AP)—Russia has promised to return the American cruiser Milwaukee to the United States before March 1, diplomatic officials said today.

A Russian crew will sail the 20-year-old warship to Lewis, Del., when Italy hands over to Russia the cruiser Duca d'Aosta as part of Italian war reparations.

Under a wartime agreement, Russia must return the Milwaukee and 12 warships borrowed from Britain as soon as it gets 35 Italian war vessels awarded to the Soviets under the Italian peace treaty.

Moscow already has notified Britain it will begin returning the British warships on Jan. 15. Included is the battleship Royal Sovereign.

The 8,030-ton Milwaukee was turned over to the Russians in 1944 by the Navy to help guard the vital sea lanes to Murmansk.

Navy department officials have said the Milwaukee will be returned from active service once it is returned because of its age.

Fence to Ban Deer O. K. If One Can Afford It

Mr. and Mrs. Clarence White, owners of a truck farm on the Umpqua River a few miles below Scottsburg, and across the Umpqua River from the Umpqua Highway, seem to be doing more than their share to "support" wildlife in their vicinity.

On a recent trip to Reedsport Mr. White explained the great damage done to his crops last fall by deer that came into the fields in groups of four or five almost every night during the growing season, eating and trampling on practically every variety of vegetables.

When Mr. White learned that an ordinary fence meant nothing in the way of an obstacle to the deer, he wrote the Oregon State
