

New Polio Cases Emphasize Need For More Money

Determination of Douglas County volunteers to make the current March of Dimes an unprecedented success was increased today with receipt of figures showing that five polio cases were reported in Oregon last week.

Dr. E. T. Hedlund, 1949 Oregon March of Dimes chairman, informed Al Henninger, head of the campaign in Douglas County, that all five patients are being treated in Portland hospitals with local chapters of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis financing care.

Two of the victims were sisters from Route 3, Corvallis, and the others were young boys, one from Mill City, another from Salem and the third from Seaside. No cases of polio were reported in Oregon the first week in January. It was the first time since July that the state had been without at least one new case a week, and the brief lapse gave pre-

ture rise to hopes that Northwestern Oregon's alarming incidence of cold-weather infantile paralysis was on the wane.

"It is too early in the year to tell whether last week's outcropping means that 1949 will be a severe polio year in Oregon, a State Board of Health official advised Dr. Hedlund.

The official, Dr. G. D. Carlyle Thompson, state director of preventive medicine, pointed out, though, that "our polio season certainly fell off slowly this winter." Dr. Thompson recalled that last January was unusual, too, there being more than a dozen new cases reported in the state during the month. He observed that incidence in Oregon counties in the ensuing months made the year the fourth worst in Oregon history from the polio standpoint. Two hundred twenty cases, in all, were reported in 1948.

Counsel for Reds Would Call All Of District Judges

NEW YORK, Jan. 21.—(AP)—A defense lawyer in the trial of 11 American Communist leaders yesterday said he would call all witnesses all federal judges in this district to try to support his attack on the jury system here.

George Crockett, Detroit Negro attorney, said Judge Harold R. Medina, presiding at the trial, would be included in the call. Medina immediately asked the lawyer to present a memorandum of law to support his right to ask a presiding judge to testify.

The defense has a motion before the court assailing the New York method of picking federal grand juries and trial juries as un-Democratic.

The 11 Communist officials, all members of the American Party's National Committee, are charged with seeking the forcible overthrow of the U. S. government.

Crockett yesterday renewed his argument that 350,000 Negroes in the Southern district of New York had been excluded in selection of juries.

In his remarks the Negro attorney urged for a "emotional outburst of yesterday" in which he sobbed while making a similar complaint about alleged exclusions of Negroes.

"You certainly wept, and wept profusely," said Judge Medina, Medina, at the opening of yesterday's session, continued to reserve decision on a prosecution motion to throw out one part of the defense jury attack.

That part is an attempt to void the conspiracy indictment on the ground it was voted by a grand jury from which members of minority groups were excluded.
