

Governor McKay Expresses Opposition to CVA Plan

EUGENE, Ore., Jan. 28.—(AP)—Governor Douglas McKay, speaking at the junior first citizen banquet here Wednesday night, gave his position on CVA and painted a bright picture for Oregon's future development.

The governor said he did not like CVA because he disliked seeing a group in Washington running things directly concerning Oregon's economy.

"I like to see authority remain at the grass roots. I'm not opposed to alphabetical organizations as long as the responsibility is entrusted at home," he said.

Oregon's Republican leader said the CVA, as presently set up, would mean the regulation of Oregon's daily economy. He also touched on the financial matters of the state, referring to the state's \$50,000,000 surplus. He pointed out that while the amount seemed like a lot of money, it was actually only enough to handle Oregon's operational expenses for four months. Higher education alone, McKay said, needs \$12,000,000 immediately and would require \$24,000,000 during the next decade.

"We're not rich and we're not poor, but we must watch our pennies carefully and invest wisely," the governor remarked.

McKay cautioned that conservation of natural resources was essential for future prosperity. He called for the supplementary irrigation and preservation of the



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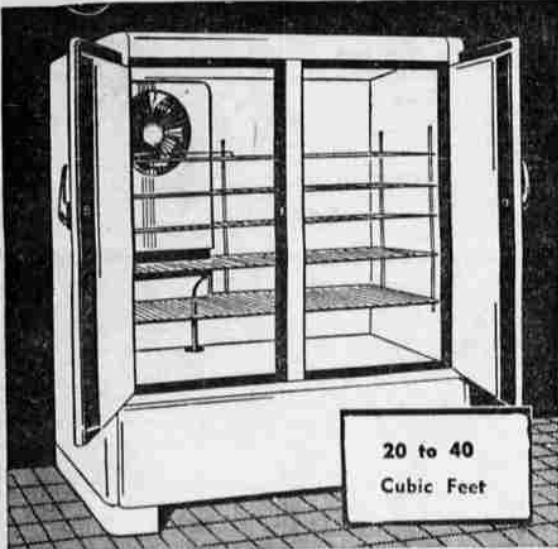
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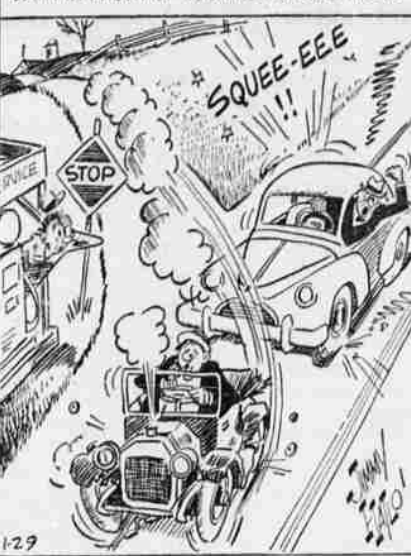

state's wildlife.

The governor said future development of the aluminum industry would greatly aid Oregon's economic status.

Axis Sally Hears Own Broadcasts At Treason Trial

WASHINGTON, Jan. 28.—(AP)—"Axis Sally" yesterday listened to herself broadcast for the wartime Nazi radio.

She showed no emotion as the government began playing recordings of the programs which brought Mildred E. Gillars, 48, to trial on a charge of treason.

For his first selection, John M. Kelley Jr., chief prosecutor, chose a recording of the "Midge at the Mike" series. It was beamed to this country by the German overseas radio May 18, 1943.

Jurors, court officials and news reporters were given small headphones to listen.

Miss Gillars was among the first to put hers on. She rested her chin on folded hands as she listened, expressionless.

The first record opened with the announcer saying the program was "for our feminine listeners especially." Then "Midge"—allegedly Miss Gillars—came to the "mike."

"This is Berlin calling," she began, "Berlin calling the American mothers, wives and sweethearts."

Committee Named To Probe Housing Problem
