

Myrtle Point Quintet Victor Over Sutherlin

The Myrtle Point Bobcats scored a 56-39 victory over a fighting Sutherlin quint that would not give up until the bitter end last night at Roseburg High School.

The Pointers, expecting an easy contest, were surprised after their own Hamnack scored the first two points, to see Joe Danchock, Sutherlin center, counter with a swisher from the key and kept on being surprised as Sutherlin, led by Tommy Haskett, high scoring forward, tied the game up at the end of the first quarter, 11-11. The Sutherlin team could not quite keep up the pace in the second period, however, and the Bobcats led at halftime, 23-16.

Sutherlin came back fighting in the third period making it a close game until the Pointers rallied and ran up a 34-26 third quarter lead. Myrtle Point took control in the final quarter and held the lead to win the contest, but they were given a tough battle by the fighting Sutherlin basketballers.

Hamnack, Bobcat forward, led all scoring for the evening with 27 points, followed by Haskett of Sutherlin with 20 counters. Hatfield had 12 for Myrtle Point and Danchock scored 10 counters for Sutherlin.

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Weidner Will Face Rough Foe In Bout With Jack Lipscomb

Many Douglas County wrestling followers predict that Billy Weidner, the "Boston Strong Man," will out-airplane spin Frankie Stojack if the acrobatic German ever meets the coast junior heavyweight titleholder. Fans will have a chance to see Weidner in action Saturday night at the Roseburg Armory where he meets Jack Lipscomb in the three-fall opener of the weekly mat show.

Headline attraction will be a non-title skirmish between Jack O'Reilly, newly-crowned coast light-heavyweight champion, and Jack Kiser, muscular Portland favorite.

Weidner was extremely impressive last week in defeating Rene Labelle, but it was a tremendous full-nelson instead of an airplane spin that turned the trick. Weidner, an ex-tumbler and hand-balancer in the circus, gains his unusual agility from his acrobatic experience. He will need all of his talent against Lipscomb.

The villainous grappler from

Indiana, who now operates a tavern in Eugene, makes up in aggressiveness what he might lack in color. But the fact remains he is one of the most-fiered wrestlers in the business and opponents try to avoid matches against him. If Lipscomb can keep away from Weidner's spin, he is given an even chance of scoring an upset victory.

Major interest, however, will be centered around the O'Reilly-Kiser clash. The Australian's jumping armlock gave him the final two falls and victory over Tex Hager when the title changed hands in Eugene last week, and he may employ the same hold against Kiser who is equally foot-footed and agile as Hager. Although not classed as a "meanie," O'Reilly is increasingly employing rough-and-tumble tactics.

The Weidner-Lipscomb opener is scheduled to get under way at 8:30 p.m., and a near-capacity crowd is expected to see the new champ also in action. Elton Owen will referee both bouts.

Indians Set For Revenge in Tilt With North Bend

The principal event on tonight's sporting calendar for local basketball fans will see the Roseburg High School Indians doing battle to avenge an earlier defeat at the hand of the North Bend Bulldogs. The game will be played at the Roseburg High School gym at 8 p.m.

Coach Jack Newby's quintet, which lost by the slim margin of 22-19 in a slow game earlier in the season, has been showing considerable promise lately. Having split a two-game series with Klamath Falls' highly rated team last weekend, the Indians are given an even chance to take the Bulldogs into camp. The latter team is currently in the upper bracket of the league.

The question of whether or not Daryl Blanck, Roseburg center, will be able to play, will probably not be decided until just before game time, and this is giving Newby plenty to think about. Blanck has a foot infection which may keep him on the sidelines.

Dexter Garey's remarkable showing against Klamath Falls, however, was very encouraging. A starting lineup of Neil Wising and Don Hubbard, forwards; Clint Agee, center, and Bob Schindler and Garey, guards, is expected to take the floor, with Bob Rogers sure to see action.

school at Jefferson City, Mo., died after being knocked out in a 175-pound novice class bout with William Holmes of Northwest Missouri State College.
