Maximum Interest Rate Reduction Aim of Bill

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 28.—(AP)—A bill to reduce the maximum interest rate on small loans from 13 to 14 per cent a month was introduced in the Legislature by Sen. Vernon D. Bull, La Grande Democrat. The bill also provides that when an employee salary is garnished, no more than 10 per cent of the salary can be claimed. Reduction of the work week of public works from 48 hours to 40 was introduced in the House.
