Gallows Claims Six More German War Criminals

MUNICH, Germany, Feb. 4.—(AP)—Six convicted war criminals, including two concentration camp inmates who turned on their fellow prisoners, were hanged yesterday at Landsberg Prison.

Three of the six were accused of killing surrendered American aviators who parachuted from damaged planes over Germany. The executions increased to 103 the number of war criminals hanged at Landsberg since Oct. 15.

One man scheduled to be hanged was given a last minute reprieve. He was Gustav Heigel, 55, an S. S. sergeant who allegedly "prepared hundreds of inmates for execution" and was rewarded with extra rations of cigarettes, liquor and sausage.

He was reprieved because of word from the department of the Army that new information bearing on his case has been found.

Giant Navy Transport Easily Spans Continent
WASHINGTON, Feb. 4.—(AP)—The huge Navy transport Constitution buckled down to routine research work today after lofting a record passenger load across the continent in one easy jump.

The giant plane—the Navy's largest—flew nonstop from Moffett Field, near San Francisco, to Washington in nine hours 35 minutes yesterday with 72 passengers and 18 crewmen aboard. Average speed: 268 miles an hour.

The Constitution weighed 184,000 pounds when it roared off Moffett Field in less than 40 seconds with the help of six rocket engines.

The Constitution can carry 168 passengers if it uses both decks.

CHAIN STORE TAX SLAIN
BOISE, Feb. 5.—(AP)—After long and frequently bitter debate, the Idaho Senate passed a bill which, in effect, eliminates the chain store tax.

The vote was 22 ayes, 20 noes, with two votes paired.

Under the measure, already passed by the House, all stores would pay a flat \$5 per year license tax instead of the present tax ranging from \$5 per year for one store to \$500 per store in chain of 20 or more.
