

Sutherland Cagers Slated to Battle Roseburg Tonight

Sutherland will have the unique distinction of playing host tonight on the varsity Indians' own floor, in a District 5 game starting at 8 o'clock.

Sutherland does not have a floor of its own as the gymnasium there is currently undergoing repairs, so they have been utilizing the facilities at Oakland and Roseburg.

Coach Jack Newby said season tickets will not be honored because of the unusual circumstance that makes the Varsity Indians visitors on their own court. Other than that, the program for the evening should not differ from other basketball contests here. Although the Sutherland cagers are not crowding the top portion of the league standings and in spite of the fact Roseburg handed the north side school a resounding 48-26 defeat, the game tonight should lack nothing in color and excitement.

"Way down" teams have a disconcerting habit of scoring wins over supposedly superior opponents. Take the case of the second Klamath Falls-Roseburg game, for instance.

Coach Jack Newby predicts the Sutherlins may score an upset if given half a chance. The local cage crew is becoming increasingly "sloppy" in the scoring department, with the exception of certain notable individuals who may get a mad scoring streak, but are unable to carry the load alone.

Coach Newby sweated the boys under the backboards in practice Monday night, hoping to get a maximum amount of scoring out of them by game time tonight.

Coach Eddy Wyatt's eighth grade Papoose outfit will start the ball rolling, with a preliminary game against Sutherland eighth graders. The initial game starts at 6:30 p. m.

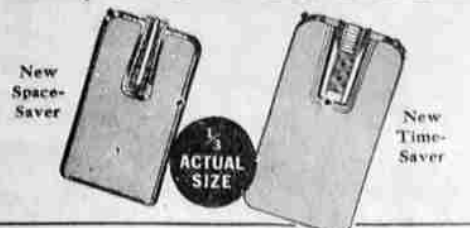
It's a question mark as to what the Roseburg team can put up in the way of KO'ed fighters, but it is reasonably sure that they will give the locals a run for their money.

PULLMAN, Wash., Feb. 8.—(AP)—Pace-setting Washington State heavily damaged second-place Oregon State's title hopes with a 47-41 basketball victory last night in the first game of a critical two-game Northern Division series.

The same teams meet here again tonight. With Bob Gambol, and Ed Gayda leading the way, the Cougars took an early lead and never let it go. The home five had a 24-21 intermission advantage.

The visitors closed the gap to 26-24 early in the second half, but Gayda caught fire and in quick succession cashed a pair of free throws and two field goals. Big Ed had 16 points for the evening.

After the Cougars had a safe margin, Coach Jack Friel sent in the second string, which piled in five points before the regulars returned to outgasp the tiring Beavers.

Cliff Crandall topped both clubs with 13 points.

Congress Gets Bill For New Marshall Plan Fund

WASHINGTON, Feb. 8.—(AP)—Legislation to continue the Marshall plan for 15 more months and authorize \$5,580,000,000 of new spending on it was introduced in Congress yesterday.

Chairman Bloom of the foreign affairs committee introduced the administration measure in the House.

The 15 months would begin next April 3, expiration date of the present law under which the Economic Recovery Administration operates.

The amount called for is \$1,580,000,000 more than Congress actually appropriated for the first 15 months of the program.

Although the basketball league standings show the Roseburg Indians in a slightly unfavorable position, the situation is not hopeless.

The Indians have still five league games to play, including the game with Sutherland tonight. Opponents to be played include Coquille here, Friday; Myrtle Creek here, Tuesday; Coquille there, Tuesday, Feb. 22, and Marshfield here Friday, Feb. 25. One other non-leaguer is scheduled, to be played against University of Oregon frosh on Feb. 18.

Marshfield, current second place holder, is theoretically the only real opposition Roseburg will face in the future. Coquille is near the bottom of the list, having lost games to Marshfield, Myrtle Point and North Bend, while winning from Reedsport and Sutherland.

Myrtle Creek, although losing four and winning three, which puts them immediately under Roseburg in the standings, has won from Reedsport, who defeated Roseburg, and North Bend, current co-league leader with Myrtle Point.

Myrtle Point still has a game to play with Myrtle Creek and two with North Bend, while North Bend has two with Myrtle Point, one with Marshfield and one with Reedsport.

Joe DiMaggio Signs For Pay Boost; Bobby Feller Consents to Slash

NEW YORK, Feb. 8.—(AP)—Joe DiMaggio signed a one-year contract yesterday with the New York Yankees, and although no figures were announced the club said he received a raise.

"It's by far the best contract I ever had," the star centerfielder said.

There was speculation that DiMaggio might receive in the neighborhood of \$100,000, depending upon whether the contract called for a bonus based on attendance at Yankee Stadium. It is his 11th Yankee contract.

Bobby Feller has signed a one-year contract with Cleveland for approximately \$72,500. It was learned it calls for an approximate \$10,000 cut from his 1948 salary of \$82,500. He will receive the same \$40,000 base contract he got last year, but the difference will be in the bonuses from the attendance.

"I'm satisfied; I deserved to take a cut," he said.
