**Personal Property Tax
Warning**
Personal property declaration forms were sent out Jan. 1, 1949 with a request for their return by Feb. 1st. To date a great number of these forms have not been returned.
Section 110-349, OCLA 1941 reads as follows . . .
"The assessor shall cause blank forms for such returns to be prepared and distributed, but failure to receive or secure the form shall not relieve any such person, managing agent or officer from the obligation of making any return herein required . . . All returns filled under the provisions of this section shall be confidential records of the Assessor's office."
Section 110-608, OCLA 1941 "Any such person, managing agent or officer who shall with intent to evade taxation, refuse or neglect to make any return herein required and to file it with the assessor within the time specified or as extended shall be subject to a penalty of Ten Dollars \$10.00 per day of the continuance of such refusal or neglect . . ."

**Proposed Labor Bill Acceptable To

WASHINGTON, Feb. 10 — (AP) — The International Typographical Union (AFL) called today for quick repeal of the Taft-Hartley law. It said retaining the act "would spell the doom of the free American trade union movement."
The I. T. U. declared that while it is not completely satisfied with the administration's labor bill, it is ready to accept the measure "on an experimental basis in the interest of speedy repeal of the Taft-Hartley Act."
The administration bill, besides junking Taft-Hartley, would restore a modified Wagner Act.
The I. T. U. views were expressed by the union's president, Woodruff Randolph, in a statement prepared for the Senate Labor Committee.
The I. T. U. has been engaged for months in a series of actions in the courts and before the National Labor Relations Board, based on the Taft-Hartley law ban on the closed shop.

**Armed Forces Still Seek Recruits
From Men With Previous Service**
A curtailment in the recruiting of new, three-year enlistees by the Army and Air Force—with higher mental and physical qualifications and a reduced quota—does not apply to men with previous service in any of the Armed Forces, T. Sgt. W. M. Stauffer, commander of the Roseburg Recruiting Station, announced.
Sgt. Stauffer said veterans still have a number of enlistment choices, and can still be enlisted with a rating as high as the second pay grade (technical sergeant in the Air Force, sergeant first class in the Army) depending on their previous training and experience.
Men who would like to serve at home can enlist for a number of famous Army divisions stationed in the United States, and be guaranteed a full, three-year hitch with that outfit, provided they were overseas after Sept. 2, 1945. On the West Coast, three battle-tested units are open to veterans who can qualify under this regulation—the 2nd Infantry Division, Fort Lewis, Wn.; the 2nd Engineer Special Brigade, at Fort Worden, Wn.; and the 4th Infantry Division, at Fort Ord, Calif.

**Berserk Gunman Wounds
Two Persons in Fusillade**
DALLAS, Tex., Feb. 10 — (AP) — A berserk gunman poured rifle fire into a downtown intersection for 20 minutes here yesterday, critically wounding a postman and hitting a Negro boy. Police captured him after firing two shots into a sixth floor YMCA room where he had barricaded himself.
Theodore Thornton, 40, a postman, was shot through the leg.
Police identified the marksman as a 28-year-old Californian, an employee of the Southwestern Bell Telephone Company.
They found 500 rounds of ammunition in his room.
Police identified the man as Charles A. Gordon, 28, of Madera, Calif. Capt. Will Fritz of the police department said Gordon identified himself as a University of California, Los Angeles, graduate and a naval veteran but refused to answer any questions concerning the shooting.

**Senate Committee OKs
Anti-Filibuster Rule**
WASHINGTON, Feb. 9 — (AP) — Senator Lodge (R-Mass.) said today the Senate Rules Committee approved an anti-filibuster rule by a 10 to 3 vote.
Lodge said the vote was for an amendment to the Senate rules so that two-thirds of senators voting could apply a gag to debate at any time.
Lodge said the three opposing votes were cast by Senators Stennis (D-Miss.), Long (D-La.) and Hunt (D-Wyo.).
The committee action merely sends the proposal on to the Senate itself.
Southern senators already have threatened to filibuster, or keep debate going indefinitely, in order to prevent the Senate from voting to adopt such a rule.

**Russian Press Gives Bad
News of U. S. Conditions**
MOSCOW, Feb. 10 — (AP) — The Russian people have been told for four consecutive days that economic conditions in the United States are growing worse.
Told in headlines, the stories in the Soviet press were:
Feb. 6 — "Fall of prices in stock exchanges and wholesale prices in the United States."
Feb. 7 — "Fall of prices on New York Stock Exchange continues."
Feb. 8 — "Worsening economic situation in the United States."
This was a lengthy article citing a rise in unemployment and other factors.
Feb. 9 — "Fall of wholesale prices in the United States."
There has been no editorial comment so far although Soviet economists have been predicting an economic crisis in the United States for some time.
