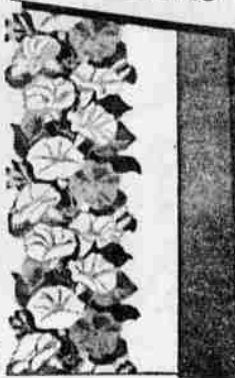

Initiation Of New Class Set By Legion Post

Umpqua Post No. 16, American Legion, will initiate a class of new members at the Roseburg Armory Tuesday, Feb. 15, at 8 p. m. Volture 1221 of the 40 and 8 will function with its initiation team, captained by "Pop" Wulf. This team won a cup at the Astoria Legion convention last year, for its activities. Department Vice Commander Sam Bove, Grants Pass, will attend. Refreshments will be served.

"Dutch Mills," Umpqua Post membership chairman, states the membership drive ended Jan. 31. However, all eligible veterans are invited to enroll and former members are urged to keep up their membership.

Umpqua Post set several membership records in 1948, exceeding its 1949 quota of 700 and setting a new all-time high in number of members. The post, with 783 members, is fourth among the "Big Ten" of the entire state, only Portland Post No. 1, Salem and Astoria Posts having greater numbers.

All new members who have not been initiated are urgently requested to attend, as this will be last initiation this spring.

Gandhi's Teachings Survive His Death to Guide India's Leaders

Good ideas can't be killed.

A year has passed since Mahatma Gandhi was shot to death by the Hindu Narayan Godse. But the teachings of the great spiritual leader go marching on with increasing strength at the head of India's awakening millions.

Godse has been sentenced to be hanged for one of the terrible crimes of the ages. Of six fellow conspirators, one was condemned to death and the rest to life imprisonment.

Godse testified at his trial that he "respected Gandhi's saintliness" but disagreed with his policies of love and tolerance for Moslems. And as the assassin and his colleagues left the courtroom after being sentenced they were shouting:

"We will conquer Pakistan (the Moslem dominion), Long live Hindustan (the dominion of Hindu India)."

The condemned men had tried to kill ideas with leaden bullets. The margin by which they failed is seen in the fact that the bequest of brotherly love left by Gandhi had much to do with preventing war between Pakistan and India at the height of the quarrel over the rich state of Kashmir. The long labor of Gandhi, the Hindu, for Moslem-Hindu peace brought striking recognition on the anniversary of his death from Khwaja Nazimuddin, governor general of Pakistan. Nazimuddin said in a message to the Indian capital of Delhi:

"In the present-day world which has failed to take a lesson from the devastation and misery caused by two world wars of this century and where the cult of violence still holds sway, it would be well to recall Gandhi-Ji's message of non-violence, for the sal-

vation of humanity lies in outlawing violence."
You will note that this Moslem leader called the Mahatma "Gandhi-Ji." That in itself is a great tribute, for the suffix "Ji" is a designation of respect and affection. You would understand that better if you knew Gandhi, as I did.

I always think of him either as "the Mahatma (great-souled one)" or as "Gandhi-Ji." Many folks were impressed that way by this humble little man who once told me that the greatest influence in his life had been Christ's Sermon on the Mount. So Gandhi-Ji's ideas march on. The prime minister of India, Pandit Jawaharlal Nehru, who is one of the world's outstanding personalities, keeps exhorting his people to follow the mahatma's teachings. So does the minister of state, Sardar Patel.
