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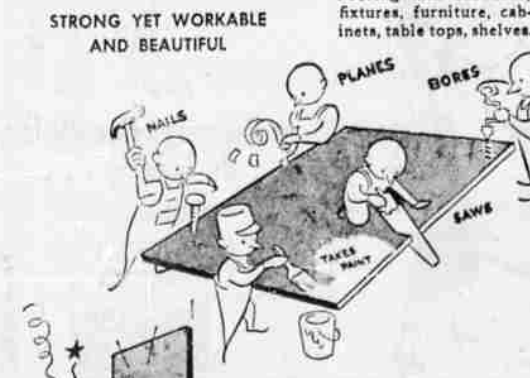
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## KID LOG

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## Wm. L. Jackson, Dean of Oregon Publishers, Dies

ALBANY, Ore., Feb. 14.—(AP)—William L. Jackson, 81, dean of Oregon publishers and co-publisher of the Democrat-Herald here, died at a hospital Saturday night. He had been a patient since Jan. 11.

He had been co-publisher since 1919, when he purchased the Albany Democrat in partnership with R. R. Cronise. They purchased the Herald, competing daily, in 1925, and merged the two publications.

Jackson had served two terms as mayor, 1933 to 1937, was chairman of the Oregon Parole Board four years, chairman of the Linn County Selective Service Board six years, a director of the Albany Chamber of Commerce and a member of the Board of the Oregon Publishers Association.

He had also served for 12 years on the Champagne Provisional Park Board and had been a trustee of Albany college, now Lewis and Clark College, Portland. He had been a member of the First Presbyterian church for more than 40 years.

Prior to entering the publishing business, he had taught school in this county. He was county school superintendent four successive terms, instituting the county's first four-year high school during his administration.

He had been a resident of Linn County since boyhood, moving here with his parents from Hannibal, Mo., where he was born Oct. 25, 1867.

Surviving are his widow, the former Minnie E. Perry, who he married in Albany Sept. 12, 1893; and two children, Glenn Jackson, Medford, Ore., and Mrs. Eugene Burns, San Francisco.

## Tenant of Cabin Wins Rent Case

Marion E. Syrek Jr., was found innocent by a Justice Court jury at Reedsport Friday of owing 90 days' rent on a cabin he occupies at Reed's Motel. In a suit brought before Justice of the Peace Fred M. Wright by Robin Reed, motel owner, Reed sought a court order of eviction.

In the absence of his attorney Gerald Kabler of Sutherlin, who was unable to be present, Reed handled his own case, charging Syrek with forcibly holding possession of the property.

Syrek's testimony was to the effect that when he first came to Reedsport, he worked for Reed on the Port Umpqua Courier, and at that time was only charged a "token" rent of one dollar a month; that after he left Reed's employ, the rent was raised to \$30 a month, which he paid for a few months before he learned that Federal Rent Control Authority had set the rent on the cabins at \$18 a month. He further testified that he attempted to pay the \$18 a month thereafter, but that such payment had been refused. During the trial, it was brought out that a suit was pending against Reed in Federal District Court for allegedly overcharging renters in this group of cabins.

## Slayer Elopes With Wife Of Man He Killed

RALEIGH, N. C., Feb. 14.—(AP)—A 23-year-old Raleigh man carefully dug a grave. He lured his landlord-friend to it, struck him with a rifle butt and buried him. Then he eloped with his victim's pretty young wife, mother of two small children.

That story, said Sheriff A. E. White of Bainbridge, Ga., was contained in a confession signed by Jack Bridges.

The sheriff continued: Bridges had become infatuated with Keston Norris Privette's wife.

Bridges dug the grave last Saturday on the rear of Privette's property near here. He took Privette, a 22-year-old mechanic, to the spot on Monday and killed him. Then he took Mrs. Privette and her two children and went to Georgia.

Mrs. Privette didn't know of the slaying until after they left here. She worried about the matter and, while Bridges was absent on a bus trip, she disclosed to officers the details of the tragic romantic triangle.

Only after Bridges' arrest and confession was the slaying here disclosed and Privette's body found.

## Free Import of Shingles From Canada Protested

WASHINGTON, Feb. 14.—(AP)—Two Washington Democrats, Senator Magnuson and Rep. Jackson, conferred with Assistant Secretary of State Thorpe about the free import of shingles from Canada.

They asked that shingles be included under a reciprocal trade clause similar to one which expired recently.

Jackson said the free importation of shingles is seriously affecting shingle mills in the Pacific Northwest.
