The former "Cash and Carry Market" in Glendale, temporarily closed, has changed hands and will re-open Monday, May 16, as a complete store, market, and locker service under the name, "The Food Bank." New proprietors are Norma L. and Hays V. Mouchett. The former proprietors were Ralph Haggard, meat market and lockers, and Mrs. Hazel Seywert, grocery section.

The new company has purchased the grocery stock of Mrs. Seywert, who has taken a lease on the store at Fortune Branch, effective June 1, and will open there with a grocery line.

Mr. Mouchett, a former resident of Glendale, was the original builder of the store and locker-plant, which is one of the most modern in the state. The Mouchetts have been living in Roseburg since last summer but are moving back here this week.

Present locker patrons will retain use of their lockers, and new rentals will be made only as old rental contracts expire on lockers not now rented.

**Funds Listed For Northwest's Army Functions**

—WASHINGTON, May 11 — (AP)—The Senate Appropriations Committee Tuesday approved a \$751,440,690 budget for Army civil functions . . . including \$87,665,800 for the Pacific Northwest and Alaska.

Oregon is listed for projects totaling \$70,521,500, including \$40,000,000 for the McNary Dam and locks on the Columbia River. Washington is allotted \$12,200,000. Idaho \$3,840,300 and Alaska \$1,044,000.

Included was a record \$722,690,690 for flood control and navigation projects of the Army Engineers in the year beginning July 1.

This is \$158,148,420 more than the amount approved by the House. The \$751,440,690 compares with \$648,575,666 appropriated for the current fiscal year and a budget estimate for next year of \$772,458,220.

The only money change from a Senate Appropriations Subcommittee's recommendations was the deletion of \$75,000 for planning Jamestown flood control reservoir on the James River in North Dakota.

**Klamath Storm Deals Damage**

KLAMATH FALLS, May 11 — (AP)—Reports Tuesday from Southern sections of the Klamath Basin told of a violent electrical and hail storm that swept those areas late Monday afternoon.

Damage was considerable to business buildings, and crops in the Tulelake area. Hail so damaged the roof of one building that rain poured through.

Thunder and lightning was reported over a wide area and a bolt of lightning struck a California Oregon Power Company transmission line in the Bonanza District, causing widespread power outage.

Lakeview, Alturas, Bonanza, Dairy, Tulelake, Merrill and Malin were points affected by the power interruption, and portions of the Klamath Falls suburbs were also without power for a short time.

The storm was short-lived and of the mid-summer variety, observers said.

**CHOKER SETTER KILLED**
