WASHINGTON, May 12 - (P)Spokesmen for the Communist and Socialist partles took opposite sides Wednesday on the North Atlantic Security Alliance. Eugene Dennis, general secre-tary of the Communist party, called the pact "aggressive" and told the Senate Foreign Relations Committee that this country "can-not even pretend to good faith" in ratified. 
