PORTLAND, May 13 — (P) — Slot machines, which vanished from this area during the anti-gambling drive early this year, were reported operating again in several private golf clubs, outside the city limits.

Sheriff M. L. Elliott said he would take action if a complaint were signed against the clubs. "They are all private clubs," he said, "and I don't think any of the boys in my office have been in them. We have to have search warrants. If someone wants to sign a complaint against the clubs, we'll do our job."

The sheriff said his officers have been checking public places and found no slot machines in operation.
