Amended Complaint In Damage Action Filed

Damages totalling \$16,643.75 were asked by Adella Riley of Myrtle Point in an amended complaint filed Monday in Circuit Court against the Pacific Greyhound Lines, Wallace A. Denman, and Arch M. Kirtley.

The plaintiff states that she had boarded a Greyhound bus at Myrtle Point, while en route to Portland May 11. Three miles east of Reedsport, on Highway 38, the complaint recites, the bus met a dump truck on the wrong side of the highway and, in attempting to avoid a collision, went over an embankment.

Both the bus driver, Denman, and the truck driver, Kirtley, were charged with negligence in operating their vehicles. The plaintiff cites serious nature of her injuries and alleges she was deprived of her livelihood as a saleslady.
