Non-Red Avowal Demanded Of Atomic Students

WASHINGTON, May 19.—(AP)—Chairman David E. Lilienthal of the Atomic Energy Commission told senators today the president of the National Research Council has agreed that a non-Communist affidavit should be required from candidates for atomic fellowships.

He made the statement to a Senate Appropriations Subcommittee which is considering the Commission's request for \$1,000,000 in funds for the 12 months beginning next July 1.

The fellowships are awards given to talented students to help them pursue studies in scientific fields. A furor has been stirred in Congress by disclosure that a \$1,600-a-year fellowship has been given Hans Freistadt, an avowed Communist who is a student of

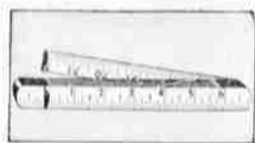
