U. S. Policy In Japan Arouses Filipino Protest

WASHINGTON, May 20.—(AP) The Philippines charged Thursday the United States is helping revive Japan's ability to wage war by calling off Japanese reparations shipments.
Gen. Carlos P. Romulo, Philippine delegate, told the 11-nation Far Eastern Commission that

At 7:30 tomorrow night, Senator Leverett Saltonstall (R.) of Massachusetts will be interviewed on the regular Saturday night "Meet the Press" broadcast.

Philippines "protest in the strongest possible terms" against the reparations decision announced last week.

Romulo charged also that the Japanese "Zaibatsu"—industrial leaders—are sabotaging American efforts to restore Japan's economy.

"There is evidence that the Japanese economic crisis has been deliberately brought on by the Japanese themselves in order to arouse American sympathy and insure American assistance," he declared.

The United States last week ordered Gen. Douglas MacArthur to make no more preliminary deliveries of machine tools and other reparations to the Philippines and three other Pacific nations.

At the same time officials made plain the U.S. will oppose any proposal to revive payment of the damages inflicted by the Japanese in World War II.

Quick Hearing On CVA Proposal Asked By Truman

WASHINGTON, May 19.—(AP) President Truman has asked the chairman of the Senate and House Public Works Committee to arrange hearings quickly on the administration's bill to create a Columbia Valley Administration.

Chairman Whittington (D-Miss.) of the House Committee said the President made the request to him and Senator Chavez (D-Mex.) of the Senate Committee at a White House Conference.

He said they told the President they would arrange hearings as quickly as possible.

Meantime, Rep. Sanborn (R-Ida.) said that the President has "stopped to play politics and pull patronage over an issue that is so serious it will affect the future of the entire Pacific Northwest."

"President Truman called Rep. Whittington, who has indicated he is not sympathetic to valley authorities, down to the White House to put pressure on him to turn a public works hearing of the House into a CVA hearing," he said, in a statement.

"It is to be assumed from reports that are current in Washington that certain Interior Department witnesses will suggest there is no need for hearings on flood control projects as set by the corps of engineers, because they have the CVA plan already set up."

President Of Brazil Speaks To U. S. Congress

WASHINGTON, May 19.—(AP) — Brazilian President Eurico Dutra told Congress today that the "perfect" friendship of Brazil and the United States is a major prop to Western Hemisphere solidarity.

Addressing a joint session of the Senate and House, he declared that the 130-year-old ties between the two nations are "founded upon their identity of purposes and harmony of interests." And he predicted they will become ever stronger.

In the international field, Dutra said, "this rare example of fraternal association" is "the greatest guarantee of good understanding and comprehension among other sister nations in this hemisphere."

He forecast that the plaudits he has received since his arrival yesterday on a state visit will be deeply felt in Brazil, "whose people are ever sensitive to manifestations of regard from this great nation, held by them in such high esteem."

Dutra spoke in Portuguese
