Jake Bird Begins Move To Postpone Gallows Death

WALLA WALLA, May 24.—(P)—Jake Bird opened maneuvers in his latest move to at least delay the executioner's rope, in U. S. District Court here Monday.

Bird, seeking a stay of execution through a writ of habeas corpus, presented his plea in person to Judge Sam M. Driver and just before noon had taken the witness stand to relate details leading up to his arrest in 1947 in Tacoma.

Before a crowded courtroom Bird demanded that he be allowed to question Pat Steele, Pierce County prosecutor whose department prosecuted Bird for the murder of Mrs. Bertha Kludt and her daughter in Tacoma.

Over objections by the state, Bird requested of Steele: "You cross-examined me one time, now you get up on that witness stand Mr. Steele and I'll really question you."

The move was allowed by Judge Driver who said that it was unusual in the light that Steele had been requested to assist the state in presenting the case.

Bird questioned the prosecutor as to his work with Pierce County. He asked questions regarding what he termed his "so-called" confession. The confession was later admitted as evidence by Judge Driver.

Court adjourned at noon.

If Bird felt any nervousness over his impending date with the gallows he did not display it other than to remark: "We got to hurry this thing up because I don't have too much time."

His execution is scheduled for May 27.

Actor Jimmy Stewart, Former Model To Wed

HOLLYWOOD, May 24.—(P)—Wedding bells will ring in August for James Stewart, one of moviedom's most stubborn bachelor holdouts, and Mrs. Gloria Hatrick McLean.

Stewart said he popped the question to the former New York model at a dinner celebrating his 41st birthday.

"To my surprise she said 'yes,'" Jimmy said. "I'm happy as a kid."

They plan a simple wedding in Hollywood when Stewart, long regarded as the films' most eligible bachelor, will be free of acting commitments.

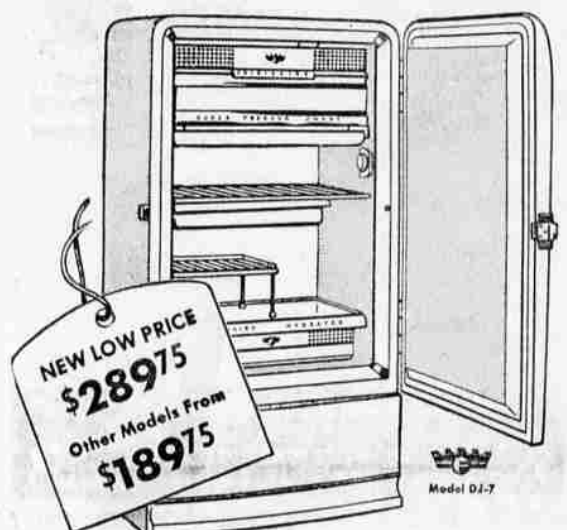

Health Insurance Draws Dissent From Sen. Taft

WASHINGTON, May 24.—(P)—Senator Taft (R-Ohio) Monday challenged an administration claim that the present system of paying for medical care is totally inadequate.

"I don't agree with that at all," Taft told J. Donald Kingsley, acting federal security administrator.

Kingsley, speaking for the administration, was the first witness before a Senate labor committee studying President Truman's national health insurance program and various counter-proposals.

Kingsley told the subcommittee the Truman plan for a payroll tax insurance plan is the only alternative to state medicine. He said the nation already is supporting a huge program of state medicine with an estimated 24,000,000 citizens receiving various kinds of federal medical care.

Kingsley also said: "It appears to be agreed upon that our present system of payment for medical care is totally inadequate."

Taft took exception to that, and added: "I don't agree with your conclusions on a dozen different things."

Taft is the chief sponsor of one of the substitute medical and hospital care bills before the subcommittee. His measure would provide upward of \$1,250,000,000 in federal grants to states over an initial five-year period.

Taft said it seems to him the administration payroll tax plan and the rest of Truman program for expansion of medical facilities and services "is a rather elaborate plan of grants and loans to all sorts of different people."

"I am firmly and honestly convinced that nothing short of the social insurance method can prevent the further—and eventually the complete—substitution of state for further—medicine."
