

WALDPORT, May 24.—(P)— Secretary of State Earl Newbry and Treasurer Walter Pearson of Robert Maclean, Waldport, as a state tax commissioner here Sunday night. At a testimonial dinner given for Maclean by friends here, the two officials said Maclean was a capable man, and a "good choice" for the position. The appointment, to become effective next month, has been criticized by some Republican leaders, mostly because veteran Commissioners Wallace Wharton and Earl Fisher will be let go. Each had served several terms. Pearson asserted, "no one is getting fired," adding that Wharton's and Fisher's four-year terms expire in June. He said there was "no political deal" between him and Maclean, and that he owed no political debts.
