The trustees agreed.

Freistadt's Atomic Energy Commission fellowship set off a recent Congressional investigation.

In a report to the trustees, the three chancelors of the University said:

"The Communists are taking advantage of the unlimited freedom of our University. And if we are not realistic, prudent and cautious, we may discover too late that we have stretched our limited to become effective July 1.


