K-Falls Power Outages Upsets Business Routine

KLAMATH FALLS, Ore., May 25.—(AP)—Protracted power outages harassed Klamath Falls Monday, cutting the heart out of the business day for commercial operations and upsetting domestic routine.

One break lasted for five hours and another for about 30 minutes. California Oregon Power Co. officials said that the power interruption came when switches blew out at the west side Link River power house.

On the second break, Marion Green, veteran Copco employee, received third degree burns from a 400-volt arc which caught him as he was working in front of the battery of switches.

The power loss forced the Herald and News to omit publication of its Monday issue. It was the first time in the experience of Frank Jenkins, veteran publisher, that his paper had failed to come out on a regular publication day.

Military Pay Hike Bill Sent Back To Committee

WASHINGTON, May 25.—(AP) The House sent back to its Armed Services Committee Tuesday a bill to raise military pay more than \$400,000,000 a year.

Rep. Case (R-SD) successfully moved that the Committee be directed to study the matter further. The vote was 227 to 163.
