



WATER RESERVOIR COMPLETED-A new, 100,000-gallon water reservoir was recently completed at Canyonville. Octagonal in shape, it was unusqued by Jacob K. Daugherty, Roseburg engineer, as the first of two such reservoirs. Top picture shows the completed reservoir at right, and old 50,000-gallon wood stave reservoir which will be used until the second new tank is constructed. The rank wall of the new reservoir are eight-inch thick concrete, heavily reinforced. They were poured monolithic by using special plywood panel forms suspended from a trussed framework. Eighty cubic yards of concrete were used and 13. 000 lineal reet or 5 8-incli reinforcing siees. The concrete tank was designed originally for a steel-framed aluminum roof. The work was done by force account under supervision of Merle Fuller, foreman, when no bids were received by the city. Lower pictures show construction scenes. 
