## Radar Of Whole World Vigil Held Future Need

BOSTON, May 26—(AP)—A radar system so sensitive that it will enable United States airmen to "watch the whole world and see what it is doing," is one of the challenges tossed to scientists by General George C. Kenney.

He declared such an advance "imperative" in an address before the meeting of the rubber division of the American Chemical Society. Kenney is commanding general of the Air University, Maxwell Field, Ala.

In fact, Gen. Kenney said, if

every nation could see day and night what the rest of the world was up to, it might be impracticable to think about war and we might have peace.

In any event, he said, the flying speeds of tomorrow will be so great as to make present warning facilities "not only obsolete but useless."

## Tornado, Hailstones Lash Town In Texas

REFUGIO, Tex., May 25—(AP)—Tornado winds struck this town of 6,000 people last night, accompanied by large hailstones and a heavy rain.

Water and gas mains were broken, leaving the city without normal water supplies.

Winds up to 60 and 90 miles an hour blew off garage roofs and littered streets with uprooted trees.

No one was hurt. Power was

knocked out for several hours. Deputy Sheriff A. W. Walzel said an inch and a half of rain fell in 10 or 15 minutes, flooding streets and wiping out gardens.
