Shotgun Newest Clue in Attack On Victor Reuther

DETROIT, May 31.—(AP)—The shotgun used in an attempt on the life of Victor Reuther, auto union official, has provided the newest clue in police efforts to track down his assailant.

The gun was found at Reuther's home Tuesday night under the window through which the double-barreled blast was fired. The shot cost Reuther his right eye.

The weapon was flown in a special state police plane to Chicopee Falls, Mass., for study by its manufacturers, the Stevens Arms Co.
