Suits For Money In Court Files

The following money action suits have been filed in Circuit Court:

Joe Serpa vs. Frank Bateman—Plaintiff asks judgment for \$450 as the amount alleged due as rental for a track layer tractor, and \$169.66 as an amount claimed for hauling logs.

Norman Anlauf vs. R. N. B. Converse—Plaintiff asks judgment for \$326.85, as the result of an alleged accident involving his car and the defendant's oil truck Feb. 22, 1948, seven miles north of Myrtle Creek on Highway 95.

State Unemployment Compensation Commission vs. H. A. Howard—Plaintiff asks judgment for \$109.95 alleged unpaid contributions, plus interest charges and penalty.

Harry M. Ward, doing business as Truck Wrecking Yard, vs. Earl Emmers—Plaintiff asks judgment for \$508.74, claiming that the defendant failed to deliver an Eaton axle as down payment on the purchase of a dual drive International rear drive axle. The axle allegedly was made to the defendant at Portland, Ore.

The Eaton axle represented a \$200 down payment. The amount asked for in the complaint represents the amount allegedly due on the equipment sold.
