

GLENDALE PROPOSES BUSINESS TAX

Chamber Urges Adoption, Also OKs New Hospital; Train Strikes Automobile

Explanation of the proposed city business tax was given City Recorder Don Sayer at the recent Glendale Chamber of Commerce meeting.

The Chamber of Commerce recommended that the City Council adopt the proposed tax as soon as possible.

possible, despite the objections of some business men that the local wholesalers, also, ought to be among those taxed by the ordinance.

The hospital committee made its report and was given the "go-ahead" signal. Plans are to be drawn up by a Portland architect in the very near future. When they are ready, the Glendale hospital drive will start. Many local mills and business men have stated that they will support the drive in the fullest way.

Question of incorporating the Chamber of Commerce was introduced, and the members present voted in favor.

A suggestion was made that everyone write to Hugh Clough,

chairman of the Budget Committee of Douglas County, in support of having a deputy sheriff stationed at Canyonville, who would cruise through the Glendale section twice a day. Sheriff Carter has included this service in his proposed budget.

Glen Studley, of the Robert Dollars Co., talked to the group on the power question, explaining that new installations will probably assure Glendale of ample power after the first of the year.

Everett Skillings was appointed general chairman of the 4th of July Celebration.

Train Strikes Car

Glendale City Councilman Harley A. Miller was struck by a train with resultant \$300 damage to his car, but with little damage to his person. Miller was driving his car across the 3rd St. railroad crossing toward Pacific Ave. and, blinded by the lights of a car approaching from the Pacific Ave. side, did not see the train until it struck his car.

The left side of the car was crushed as it was dragged about 120 feet toward the depot from the point of collision. Miller is said to have no serious injuries, although his shoulders have been stiff since the accident. He tried

to drive his car from the scene but found it too badly damaged.

Last American Artillery Battalion Quits Korea

SEOUL, June 1 — (AP) — A trustworthy source said Tuesday the last American artillery battalion in Korea had gone home.

It departed, said this source, on May 28—Saturday—aboard a ship bound for Hawaii.

This battalion's departure has not been confirmed by the Army or State Departments.

A heavy portion of the battalion's equipment reportedly was turned over to the Korean republic's new Army.

Three infantry battalions of a U. S. regimental combat team remain in Korea. These American forces, best sources say, are due to leave by the end of July. After that about 500 men with attached service units are to stay here as a training mission.

About eight and one-half million youngsters are now enrolled in United States high schools.

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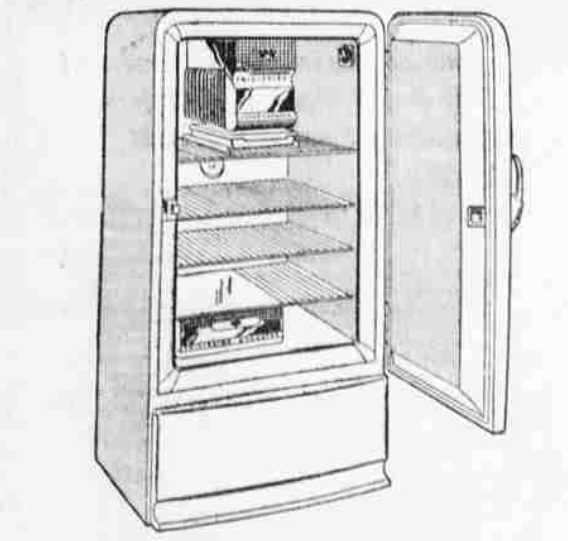
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
