

Killer Of Banker Slain As He Runs Into Courthouse

JASPER, Ark., June 2. — (AP) — A bank president was wounded fatally, and shortly afterward his assailant—whose motive was uncertain—was shot dead in this small Ozark Mountain town late Tuesday.

The banker, J. W. Moore, 62, head of the Newton County bank here, died today at a Harrison, Ark., hospital. He was shot once in the abdomen.

The banker's assailant was identified from papers on his person as Albert Herman Mayer, 34, once of Chicago but more recently from Roland, Ark.

Moore was shot while talking to a friend on the lawn of the Newton County Courthouse. Then Mayer ran into the building where he exchanged shots with Sheriff Russell Burbine and others but

Community Honors Man To Whom It Owes Lot

UNION CITY, Okla. — (AP) — This farm community in central Oklahoma owes a lot to one man—and it doesn't forget.

The man is Dr. P. P. Richardson, who was surprised by 500 persons who joined in celebrating his 80th birthday with a basket dinner and program. Dr. Richardson has been practicing 55 years here and has been the only physician since the turn of the century.

Besides his profession, the doctor is also president of the town's only bank, the only druggist, and its former postmaster—an office now held by his wife.

Dr. Richardson also has been mayor more times than he can remember and has served as president of the Oklahoma State medical society and as a member of the Oklahoma banking commission.

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p. m., Pacific Standard Time, June 16, 1949, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 10 acres within Section 22, T32S, R3W, V. M., Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 327,000 feet B. M. more or less of Douglas-fir, 54,000 feet B. M. more or less of sugar pine and 11,000 feet B. M. more or less of western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. Sealed bids accompanied by required payment and received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p. m. June 16, 1949, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted for information of all bidders. No bid of less than \$7.65 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$24.95 per M feet for sugar pine, \$1.35 per M feet for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.65 per M feet B. M., to cover the cost of free planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. \$2,000.00 must accompany each sealed bid and must be shown to be in the possession of oral bidders as a qualification for auction bidding. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately make the required payment and confirm the bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full informa-

tion concerning the timber, the condition of sale and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Roseburg, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Tiller, Oregon.

Cleaner's Broom Still Active After 47 Years

SPENCER, W. Va. — (AP) — Americans lay proud claim to being the earth's most mechanically-minded people, but 76-year-old Lon Love says you can't prove that fact by him. Just hired for the 47th straight year as Spencer's street foreman, Love insists he'll continue to clean the city thoroughfares with a broom, just as he always has done.

Love is non-committal about reports of recent weeks that council now has definite plans to provide him with some mechanical device. The members of the city governing body have volunteered to donate their annual salary of \$60 each toward buying street cleaning equipment. Mayor Eddie Farmer says he will match the sum contributed by council.

Meanwhile, Love continues to work each morning at 3 o'clock and stay on the job until around daylight. Police Chief Ernest Barnes, who formerly worked the night shift, says he could set his watch by the veteran city employee's appearance.

Love is considered the only living person to know the complete Spencer sewage system from memory. Many of the lines were installed years ago, and no blueprints were made of their routes.

State Hospital To Have New Unit For T-B Patients

SALEM, June 2. — (AP) — The State Board of Control has decided to build a \$180,000 hospital building to care for tuberculosis patients at the Oregon State Hospital.

It will take care of 120 patients, and will be similar to an existing 120-bed hospital for tuberculosis patients at the institution.

Dr. Charles E. Bates told the Board he needs more space for his tuberculosis patients. Money will come from the \$2,000,000 which the Legislature appropriated for state institution buildings. About \$1,000,000 of that amount will be used for another cell block at the penitentiary, and \$850,000 for State Hospital buildings.

The board also voted to spend \$22,000 to provide new mortuary quarters at the State Hospital.

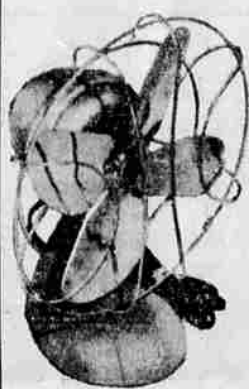
