

SALEM, June 2.—(AP)—Oregon's unemployed got \$1,472,252 in state benefits during May, the State Unemployment Compensation Commission says.

That was 36 per cent less than during April, but it was 60 per cent more than in May, 1948.

Of the total, \$895,000 went to persons without war service, while former service men and women got \$576,000 under the federal GI Bill of Rights. The GI benefits end July 25.

The number of unemployed persons receiving checks dropped to 16,669 in May, which was only a fourth of the winter's peak in February. Most of the decline in unemployment was caused by resumption of work in the woods and sawmills.

Only 2,664 logging and lumber workers were getting benefits last week, compared with almost 15,000 in February.

High-Perch Stars Amaze Crowds

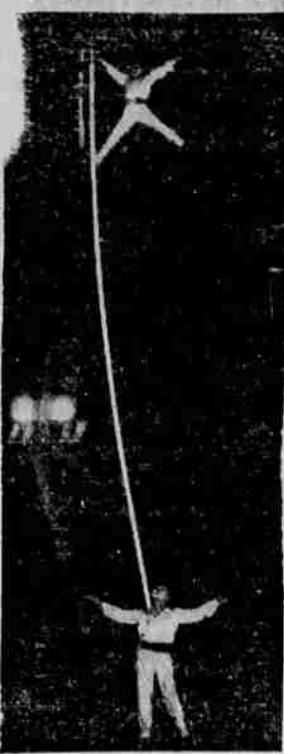
