Love Triangle Suspected In Airplane Catastrophe
MANILA, June 3. — (P) — A love triangle may have caused the mysterious explosion of a C-47 transport plane that killed 13 persons last month.
National Bureau of Investigation agents said they have information a woman and her lover had a time bomb placed aboard the plane to kill her husband.
Dispatches from Daet in South Luzon said the Bureau was now assembling the facts.
The plane, a Philippine Air Lines transport, blew up in the air on May 7 after taking off from Daet for Manila.
A spokesman for the NBI said a formal complaint of multiple murder is expected to be filed soon in court at Daet. He would not go into further details.
