Opponents Pouring Cold Water On Columbia Valley Authority Plan

NEA Washington Correspondent WASHINGTON.-Fancy shenanigans are going on around her connection with the Columbia Valley Authority plan.

President Truman first tried to get Senate and House to hold joint hearings on his pet bill to set up a CVA. He called Sen. Dennis Chavez of New Mexico and Congressman William M. Whittington of Mississippi to the White House to talk about it. They are chairmen of Senate and House Public Works Committees.

Whittington blocked joint hearings. He said his committee had so many other things to do it couldn't possibly get around to CVA before mid-June. Truth of the matter is that his committee is believed to be divided 14 to 13 in favor of CVA, though Whittington himself is against it. On the side, Whittington is vice president of the National Rivers and Harbors Congress. This is the semi-official kingfish in the powerful water lobby, which is opposed to all valley authority plans. Whittington blocked joint hear-

So it was left for Senator Chavez's committee to hold hearings first and alone. As near as can be figured out this Senate Public Works committee has only two Democrats in favor of CVA—Chavez and Senator Sparkman of Alabama, a strong TVA man. The other six Democrats and all five Republicans—headed by Sen. Republicans—headed by Sen. Harry Cain of Washington—are against CVA. So it has no more chance than any snowball in June on Capitol Hill. Nevertheless, the committee will go through the mo-tions of holding CVA hearings.

In the meantime, Chairman Whittington of the House Public Works Committee has made a fast play of his own. On short notice, his committee held one-day hearings on what is known as the Army Corps of Engineers-Bureau of Reclamation-Weaver-Newell plan for Columbia River development.


