Two Camp Fire Girls cabins were roughed in, playground cleared and 1800 feet of water pipe laid at Camp Tye Sunday by volunteer workers.

Active Club members, headed by Ken Atterbury and Roy Barnhart, and including Larry James, Jim Loomis, Lowell Atterbury, Paul Wray, Glenn Jones, Clarkson Chitwood and Bill Hensen, did the work on the cabins, while fathers of Camp Fire Girls and Council members laid the pipe. One of the fathers screened in the cookhouse kitchen.

Lumber for the cabins was donated by Youngs Bay Lumber Company and Andrus and Hult mill. Buckley Bell furnished building blocks. Interstate Tractor supplied a bulldozer, and it was hauled to the site by Flegel Transfer and Storage, all without charge.

Joe Fest, brick mason contractor, will direct the construction of a fireplace at the camp next Sunday, and a work director will be available each Sunday until camp time to supervise needed work. Fest will be assisted by members of the Knights of Pythias.
