McKay Names Council To Recodify Laws Of Oregon

SALEM, June 10.—(AP)—Governor McKay Wednesday appointed the Statute Revision Council which will recodify and simplify all of Oregon's laws.

Members are Dr. Kenneth J. O'Connell, University of Oregon Law School, chairman; Senate President William E. Walsh, Coos Bay;

House Speaker Frank J. Van Dyke, Medford; Colonel R. Eberhard, La Grande lawyer; William H. Masters, Portland lawyer; former State Sen. William W. Baldree, Grants Pass lawyer; and Frank Jenkins, Klamath Falls publisher.

The Council will submit its work to the 1951 Legislature. It would give Oregon its first revision in 80 years.

The state laws now total 10 big volumes, but the council is expected to condense this into one or two volumes.

The council will hire an expert who has done similar revisions in other states.

The work was ordered by the 1949 Legislature.
