

School Director Vote Set June 20

Barring an unexpected write-in campaign, next Monday's school director election for Roseburg District 4 will be an uncontested affair.

Only two candidates for two openings have filed. They are N. D. "Nat" Johnson, who has filed for the five-year term,

which will be vacated by the expiration of J. P. Molschenbacher's term, and the two-year position, filed for by Jack Doyle.

Doyle, appointed to the board to succeed Paul Keith who moved from the city, is a candidate to succeed himself.

The election will take place in the Junior High School Monday, June 20, from 2 to 7 p. m.

This is the same date for election of all school directors in the county districts.

Oral auction bids will be received by the Regional Forester or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Roseburg, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p. m., Pacific Standard Time, June 27, 1949, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting, and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 948 acres within Sections 23, 24, 25, 26, 35 and 36 T29S, R1W, W. M., surveyed, Umpqua National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 25,166,000 feet B.M., more or less, of Douglas fir, 5,301,000 feet B.M., more or less, of sugar pine, 311,000 feet B.M., more or less, of ponderosa pine, 2,286,000 feet B.M., more or less, of white fir, 657,000 feet B.M., more or less, of western hemlock, 1,631,000 feet B.M., more or less, of California incense-cedar, and an unestimated amount of white pine and other species of saw timber. Sealed bids accompanied by required payment received by the Forest Supervisor prior to 2:00 p. m., Pacific Standard Time, June 27, 1949, will be considered the equivalent of an oral bid and posted for the information of all bidders. The appraised value of the timber according to long-term, normal market and operating conditions is \$3.50 per M feet for Douglas-fir, \$10.00 per M feet for sugar pine and white pine, \$4.00 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$1.00 per M feet for white fir, western hemlock, California incense-cedar and other species of saw timber.
