

Girl Shoots Phils' First Baseman

CHICAGO, June 15. — (AP) — Eddie Waitkus, 29, Philadelphia Phillies star first baseman, was shot near the heart early today by a 19-year-old girl who told police she was a "fit case for a psychiatrist."

Hospital attendants reported his condition this morning as "fair."

She shot Waitkus with a .22 caliber rifle just after he entered her room in the fashionable Edgewater Beach Hotel on Chicago's North Shore. He went there after receiving a note from her that it was "extremely important" that he see her. She told police later that she was not acquainted with Waitkus.

The girl was identified by police as Ruth Ann Steinhaugen, a typist employed in a Chicago loop office. She earlier gave a fictitious name and a Boston address.

Miss Steinhaugen calmly told reporters she had had an "urge to kill somebody" which had built up within her for about two years. Police Capt. John T. Warren said she told him she had been undergoing psychiatric treatment for a nervous disorder.

Destroyed was the Arkley Lumber Company mill at the highway approach to Eugene where the city's main industrial district is concentrated. Damage was placed at between \$50,000 and \$75,000.

Firemen were able to save the neighboring Associated and Eugene Plywood Mills and smaller lumber plants.

The Arkley mill had been closed for over a month and cause of the fire was not determined. It was believed fully insured.

Boy Admits Setting Fire That Razes Portland School Units

PORTLAND, June 15. — (AP) — A 14-year-old schoolboy was held today in the burning of two portable grade school units in one of two fires that resulted in an estimated \$215,000 damage last night.

Destroyed in North Portland was the main mill of the Peninsula Fuel and Lumber Company on North Vancouver Avenue. Owner Charles Weeks estimated the damage at \$200,000. Cause was not determined.

Arson police squadmen said the boy held in setting the Dunway Grade School units had admitted piling papers and rags and lighting the pile. Companions who had witnessed the incident confirmed it, police said.

Furniture Store Landmark At Canby Leveled By Flames

CANBY, Ore., June 15. — (AP) — A large furniture store here, a landmark since 1908, was destroyed by fire last night.

Firemen worked for three hours to get the blaze under control and save two adjoining business structures.

Burned out was the Ellery Furniture Company, operated by Mr. and Mrs. James M. Ellery. Several thousands of dollars worth of merchandise was carried to safety.

Heat Wave Threatens Forests, Crop Losses

and the two-weeks drought danger to farms and forests in New York state but, the Weather Bureau says, no heavy falls appeared imminent.

The state college of agriculture at Cornell University at Ithaca said the state faces a "first class drought emergency" unless there is rain soon. Yesterday's temperatures ranged in the high 80s and low 90s across New York state.

Forest Fires Subdued
Several small forest fires have been reported in the New England states and New York state. Eleven are burning in the Adirondack mountains but all are under control. There have been 25 since Saturday.

The hot and humid weather has wiped out early gains in the Hudson Valley's biggest crop, fruit, and it is expected to be "just normal" instead of the earlier forecast "exceptionally good."

Rain hasn't fallen in the nation's capital for 18 consecutive days today—the longest spring drought in the 43 years of recorded weather history.

PORTLAND, Ore., June 15. — (AP) — Foresters climbed lookout towers throughout the Pacific Northwest today as high temperatures and low humidity brought the worst fire hazards of the season.

Their warnings to motorists, campers and fishermen and to logging operators in the region were heightened by scattered lumber mill fires in Oregon yesterday.

In the Moses Lake area of Eastern Washington, a grass fire was believed halted last night after racing with the wind about 35 miles in 24 hours. Buildings at the O'Sullivan dam project in the Columbia River basin were under guard as the flames menaced the area.

Thousands of acres of forest land was being closed to the public. Logging halts when the humidity touches 30 percent and levels below the danger-mark were due today.

He was killed by a sniper and his remains were sent here by citizens of the French community where he was stationed.

"The flag is the heart and soul of Elksdom, as it is the symbol and heart and soul of America," Mayor Flegel stated.

He indicated that the flag America and Elksdom honor "holds in its folds a story besides which the Iliad and the Odyssey pale into insignificance."

The crash of trees, the crack of frontier rifle, the sweat of the plowman and the clang of hammer-blown forges are all a part of the history of the flag, Flegel pointed out.

In war as in peace, the American flag continues to fly, Flegel affirmed. "From the first roar of flint rock musketry to the roar of the mighty atom bomb at Hiroshima, American men, under the flag, have fought for the ideals of liberty."

"That's the heritage of the American flag to which all Elksdom pays tribute on June 14. The things for which it stands are the things upon which Elksdom is founded—the broad principles of charity, justice, brotherly love and fidelity that are the cornerstones of Elksdom and what men beneath the flag call the "square deal."

"Men have fought for them; men have died for them. That is what America means—that is what Elksdom means," Flegel concluded.

Senate Nearing Vote On Labor Bill Amendments

in which case no affidavits would be required.

3. Require unions and companies to file financial reports.

4. Guarantee "free speech" in labor union management makes statements containing any "threat, express or implied, of reprisal or force" or other, express or implied, of benefit."

Whether action on all four amendments would be completed today depended on how many Senators speak on them.

Senator Taft (R-Ohio), one of the administration bill's major opponents, said he expected all four proposals to be approved today, after which the Senate will begin a major scrap over "national emergency" strikes.

In that connection, Senator Douglas (D-Ill.) told a reporter he and Senator Hill (D-Ala.) would formally introduce a fifth amendment providing for government seizure of plants—up to 90 days—to delay strikes imperiling the national health or safety.

When the national emergency struggle is over—maybe some time next week—Taft will try to get a lot more Taft-Hartley features into the labor bill by substituting his own proposals for the whole administration measure.

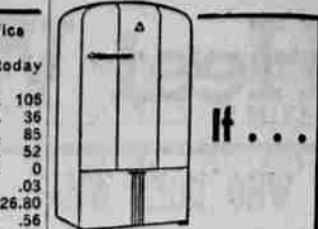
