Federal Budget Outlook Is Worse Since Truman Asked Tax Increase

WASHINGTON, June 16.—(AP)—A budget deficit more than double the \$600,000,000 forecast by President Truman now appears in the making for fiscal 1949 when it ends June 30. Some officials said the seasonal spurt in income tax collections

from quarterly payments which fell due yesterday, will have to be impressive to hold the deficit as low as \$1,200,000,000 or even \$1,500,000,000. With the government heading that deep into the red this year after two consecutive years of

Moscow Preparing Economic Drive To Strangle Rebellious Yugoslavia

For a change we apparently are about to witness a wide-open fight in the Eastern European Communist bloc to settle a family quarrel which finally has become too serious to be kept under cover. Russia is reliably reported about to take heavy direct action against politically rebellious Yugoslavia, headed by tough and independent Marshall Tito, Moscow and its other satellite states are said to be prepared to launch a great offensive against Yugoslavia to inflict "economic strangulation" on that premier Balkan state. This drastic program is said to have been laid down at a meeting of the "Cominform" (successor to the Comintern, or general staff for world revolution) which has been meeting in Poland. July 1 is the date said to have been fixed for the opening of the grand offensive.

Yugoslavia was expelled from the Cominform a year ago, after her government was accused of a policy hateful to Russia and of other deviations from Marxist-Leninist theory. Tito himself was roundly castigated. Naturally this created a major sensation, for Yugoslavia is the major Balkan state. The mighty Cominform had its seat in Belgrade, the capital. Tito was one of the outstanding figures of Communism and stood high in the regard of the Moscow Kremlin. Yugoslavia was one of the brightest stars in the Russian crown. If you will look at your map of Europe you will see one vital reason. This big state lies on the Adriatic Sea which gives access to the Italian coast across the way and to the Mediterranean. In other words, Yugoslavia is a military base of tremendous value, and so long as the country was under complete control of Moscow, it was to all intents a Russian base. Now the strategy of the com-

surplus—there was some speculation over whether the President might take the occasion to renew his January request for a \$4,000,000,000 tax increase. The budget outlook has turned worse since Mr. Truman asked the tax increase to (1) overcome a deficit he estimated at \$873,000,000 for the new fiscal year beginning July 1 (congressional staff estimators say this will be tripled in actual practice) and (2) to permit a substantial reduction in the \$251,500,000,000 federal debt. For expiring fiscal 1949, expenditures have been holding close to the pace of President Truman's January estimate of \$40,180,000,000, which counted on an 18 per cent increase over fiscal 1948. Revenue receipts, however, have been running almost 10 per cent below last year. Instead of the 6.2 per cent below that Mr. Truman anticipated in his estimate of a \$39,580,000,000 total in take this year. For that reason, the interim deficit—which means excess of spending over income to date—stood above \$2,000,000,000 with less than three weeks left in the fiscal year.

AFL Official Charges Waste In Tech Institute

PORTLAND, June 16.—(AP)—An AFL official withdrew from the advisory committee of the Oregon Technical Institute at Klamath Falls Tuesday and said the school was a waste of public funds. Kelley Loe, assistant secretary of the State Federation of Labor, said the school's training was "questionable" and a waste of the students' time and money. He reiterated an earlier AFL position on the school. This favored an on-the-job training program through apprenticeships. Loe said the school once estimated its needs at \$300,000, but submitted a request for \$1,800,000 at the last Legislature. This was cut to \$940,000. He said the school cost the state \$1,600 per pupil each year. Vocational classes in Portland Public Schools—used to supplement apprentice training—cost \$170 yearly per pupil, he added. "The Klamath Falls school is just building up a bureaucracy in the vocational educational field," Loe asserted. Presentation Of 4-H Pin To Truman Has Officials Puzzled As To Reason

WASHINGTON, June 16.—(AP)—Dusty yellow files have saved a lot of faces from being bright red today. American boys and girls of 4-H Clubs are giving President Truman an honor pin. A Department of Agriculture Committee working up programs and speeches suddenly realized it didn't know why the pin was being awarded. It had all other details: ceremonies will be during the 19th annual 4-H camp attended by about 250 boys and girls from the U. S. and nine other nations. The pin itself is shaped like a four-leaf clover with four H's on it. Presentation will be by Don Rutter of Shelbina, Mo., Mary Alice Bowers of Cushing, Okla., Don Warnock of Baker, Ore., and Carol E. Martin of Cheshire, Mass. But not knowing the "why" had plans at a standstill. The White House was no help; aides didn't know enough of Mr. Truman's 4-H background. A wire to Missouri failed to bring an immediate answer. Those who might know were enroute to Washington. As a last resort clerks searched old files of Agriculture Department Extension Service bulletins. Finally they found what they wanted in a 1945 issue: The President helped found the Jackson County Farm Bureau in Missouri and a boys and girls club in Washington township back in 1913.
