Swim Pool Manager Brown To Attend Red Cross Aquatic School Session; Betty Smith Instructs Local Class

Ray Brown, manager of the Roseburg Swimming Pool, will attend the Red Cross Aquatic School to be held at Camp Longfellow, Wildcat Lake, near Bremerton, Wash., from June 20 to 30. L. L. Powers, chairman of the Douglas County Chapter, announced.

While Brown will receive instruction in swimming, life saving, water safety, boating and canoeing, first aid and accident prevention, and swimming pool management and leadership. In addition to the regular classes, seminars will be held on such subjects as water pageantry, competitive swimming and other closely related subjects. Upon the satisfactory completion of this school, Brown will be issued a Red Cross certificate as a Water Safety instructor.

The Red Cross swim program for Douglas County, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Betty Smith is being conducted at the Roseburg Pool under Brown's supervision, with the aid of volunteer swimming instructor assistants. At the present time, the Douglas County Chapter has a limited number of certified instructors: Mrs. Kenneth Oakley, Mrs. Dorothy Moore and Allen Knudtson, Jr., Mrs. Margaret Siefarth and Mrs. Jack Josse have been assisting in the Water Safety program as instructors. Mr. Powers

asks that those who are qualified, although not necessarily certified, as swimming instructors and are interested in helping in this program come to the Red Cross offices in the Armory and volunteer their services in order that the fullest possible advantage may be taken of the excellent swimming pool Roseburg now has.

Roseburg youngsters have been participating in beginner classes since June 7 and will complete their first course the end of this week. Throughout the swimming season new classes will be organized and started every two weeks. Children and adults who wish to receive Red Cross Water Safety instruction should register at the chapter offices in the Armory or at the pool.
