House Committee Shies At Request To Investigate Text Books Used In U. S. Schools

WASHINGTON, June 22.—(AP)—A projected congressional probe of school books appears to have backfired into a House Un-American Activities Committee wastebasket. Republican Committee members denounced it and Democrats followed through with a prediction that the Committee will drop it like a hot potato. It appeared likely that any investigation made now will be by a special commission of noted educators, possibly headed by General Dwight D. Eisenhower, president of Columbia University. Committee Chairman Wood (D.-Ga.) said he was at a loss to "know what all the shooting is about" and insisted that the Committee is not investigating textbooks. "Purely preliminary steps," he told newsmen, have been taken by Committee investigators as a result of complaints by the Sons of the American Revolution. These complaints, he said, made "some very grave charges" involving Communism in schools. "I think," Wood said, "that the educators themselves would be interested in refuting the charges if they are not true." The three active Republican members of the Committee agreed that the educators themselves should make the study. In a joint statement they disassociated themselves from the proposed inquiry which they said was undertaken by the Committee staff "at the request of some of the majority members" and without the advance knowledge of the Republicans. Rep. Walter (D.-Pa.), a committee member, agreed with the Republicans that "distinguished educators" should make the investigation. He insisted that there is no formal committee investigation underway and attributed the furor to "an unfortunate interpretation" of a letter sent out by Committee investigators. Methodist Bishop G. Bromley Oxnam said in an address at Wellesley, Mass., that "free men may well be alarmed when edu-

Fee Alleged Paid For Getting Government Contract

WASHINGTON, June 22.—(AP)—Chairman Hoye (D.-N. C.) of the Senate Investigating Committee has announced an inquiry into the report of a \$1,000 fee paid for help in getting government contracts. Hoye said the investigation will be based on "articles in the New York Herald Tribune concerning a 'Washington five percent.'" Hoye quoted the newspaper as reporting that Paul Grindle, a Massachusetts businessman, said he paid the \$1,000 to James V. Hunt, "management counselor." He identified Hunt as a former lieutenant colonel in the Army Quartermaster Corps and later an employee of the War Assets Administration. Hoye said William P. Rogers, chief attorney for the investigating group, will "make a complete investigation of all the facts." The Herald Tribune, in a copy-righted story by Jack Steele from Washington, said Hunt had told Grindle of close friendship and influence with top-level officials here including: Maj. Gen. Harry H. Vaughan, military aide to President Truman; Secretary of Defense Louis A. Johnson; Maj. Gen. Herman Teldman, Army quartermaster general; Jess Larson, former WAA administrator; John R. Steelman, assistant to President Truman, and others. Grindle was identified as president of the C. W. Laing Wood-
