Legislative, Executive, and Judi-cial, has in fact for some time (ex-cept for the years 1947 and 1948 when the Republicans controlled Congress) been completely con-trolled by one political party. The Democrats fought the amendment and it was defeated.

Now they will be appointed by President Truman anyhow.
