Umpqua Forest Fire Precaution Rules Announced

Beginning July 1, campers on the Umpqua National Forest will be required to take certain precautionary measures against fire—by both proclamation of the governor and federal regulations applying to all national forests. Ray B. Hampton, fire control officer of the Umpqua National Forest, announced that camp fire permits will be required everywhere on the forest except on designated improved camp grounds.

designated improved camp grounds.

Smoking while traveling in automobiles is prohibited except on two-lane surfaced roads. This regulation does not apply to the North Umpqua Highway between the forest boundary and Big Camas, said Hampton, smoking is prohibited in automobiles.

Camping tools, including axe, shovel and bucket, are also required except when traveling as a pedestrian or at designated improved camp grounds on nation-

a pedestrian or at designated im-proved camp grounds on nation-al forests.

Throwing away lighted mater-lals is prohibited on the forest, as well as the use of fireworks of all kinds, Hampton said. Signs reminding visitors on the forest of these fire regulations have been posted on roads and public campgrounds.


