Umpqua Forest Fire Precaution Rules Announced

Beginning July 1, campers on the Umpqua National Forest will be required to take certain precautionary measures against fire—both by proclamation of the governor and federal regulations applying to all national forests.

Ray B. Hampton, fire control officer of the Umpqua National Forest, announced that camp fire permits will be required everywhere on the forest except on designated improved camp grounds.

Smoking while traveling in automobiles is prohibited except on two-lane surfaced roads. This regulation does not apply to the North Umpqua Highway between the forest boundary and Big Camas, said Hampton, smoking is prohibited in automobiles.

Camping tools, including axe, shovel and bucket, are also required except when traveling as a pedestrian or at designated improved camp grounds on national forests.

Throwing away lighted materials is prohibited on the forest, as well as the use of fireworks of all kinds, Hampton said. Signs reminding visitors on the forest of these fire regulations have been posted on roads and public campgrounds.



Old Eli's Sons, Who Years Ago Sang 'Boola Boola,' Now Taking Life Easy Making Plenty Of 'Moola Moola'

NEW YORK—(AP)—Ever wonder what happened to good old Frank Merritt after he left Yale?
He seems to have been lost in the crush of years, but a number of Old Eli's other sons have done right well by themselves.
Yes, sir, the lads who stayed up all night a quarter of a century ago singing "Boola, Boola" can sleep late now because they are making plenty of "moola moola."
The class of 1924 has done all right for itself. In fact I have come to the conclusion, after studying some statistics compiled for the class's 25th reunion this year, that one of the signs of a misspent life is not to have been graduated from Yale University the year Calvin Coolidge was elected President.
These highly secret figures were smuggled to me by a rival friend who sent them here, hidden in an old pumpkin, via an intermediary. The man traveled on a coach car of the New York, New Haven and Hartford Railway to avoid detection.
The statistics show that 25 years after leaving Yale's ivory tower the boys have an average earned income of \$17,210 and an average income from all sources of \$35,111. The largest single income was a tidy \$400,000.
The boys have turned out to be good steady husbands. They carry an average of \$55,262 in life insurance—enough to cheer any prospective widow. Some 71 percent have one or more servants and only 7.1 per cent have wives who work outside the home.
More than 82 percent have never been fired from a job and 12.2 percent were only fired once.
The class of 1924 produced only one clergyman, one orator, one librarian, one radio broadcaster, one newspaperman and one man willing to describe himself as a philanthropist.
But it turned out 16 bankers, 31 educators, 22 insurance men, 37 lawyers, 22 investment brokers, 22 physicians and 68 manufacturers.
Today, 149 men own all or part of their businesses, 54 own no part. Six are board chairmen, 34 are company presidents, 44 are vice presidents, 36 are partners and at least 30 are full owners. Five men have already retired.
Not Many Children
A total of only 626 children of both sexes was reported by 330 class members, indicating Yale will have to look beyond its own graduates for its future crop of freshmen. Only two men had as many as six children. Forty-two had none.
Some 194 men thought the country was in for more inflation, 90 thought prosperity would continue, 37 foresaw recession and 177 a depression. On the other hand 161 thought the outlook was good, 125 believed it was fair and only 10 poor. Yale men are self-reliant. They believe in themselves.
The class favored the Marshall Plan 273 to 47, the United Nations 275 to 40, the atom bomb policy 266 to 42. They opposed a government-sponsored health program 37 to 259, and were against Truman's tax proposals 29 to 288. Incidentally, they paid an average in \$8,609 in taxes last year.
Some 104 thought war is inevitable to 157 who didn't.
Dewey Heavily Favored
In the last election 82.7 percent reported they voted for Thomas E. Dewey, 67 percent backed Truman, 2 percent Wallace and 8 percent Norman Thomas.
