Radio Will Give Weather Reports To Logging Men

Logging operators of this county will receive twice daily radio broadcasts of fire weather information from two statewide radio networks during the fire season, according to Albert Wiesendanger, executive secretary of the Keep Oregon Green Association.

The daily broadcast over state station KOAC is a cooperative project sponsored by the U. S. Weather Bureau, Keep Oregon Green Association and Radio Station KOAC, Wiesendanger said. Fire weather news will also be broadcast to the logging operators twice daily at 8:25 a. m. and 8:00 p. m. Pacific Standard Time over radio station KBDY, 3397.5 kilocycles. Each broadcast will be repeated ten minutes later, both morning and evening, over State Board of Forestry station KOA 413 at a frequency of 2236 kilocycles.

Wiesendanger pointed out that these twice daily broadcasts started July 1st and were developed to place the latest possible fire weather information in the hands of logging operators so they could plan each day's operation in accordance with weather conditions. The fire prevention leader urged loggers to maintain their outstanding fire record of the past ten years by taking every precaution. He suggested that fire tools and equipment should be kept in tip-top shape at all times, that watchmen be provided where needed at logging landings, and other areas where hazard and

Harry Bridges Denied Permit To Leave U. S. To Attend Conference

SAN FRANCISCO, July 7.—(AP) Harry Bridges yesterday lost in his efforts to leave the United States under bond and attend a world-wide maritime conference in France.

Bridges had been named by the CIO Longshoremen's Union, which he heads, and by the CIO Marine Cooks and Stewards, as their representative to the World Federation of Trade Unions conference at Marseilles.

The longshore leader is under federal indictment here, accused of perjury and conspiracy in obtaining citizenship papers in 1945. He is at liberty under a \$5,000 bond pending trial.

The union offered to post \$100,000 bail to guarantee that Bridges would be here for his trial. Federal Judge Michael J. Roche rejected the idea.

The government offered no objection to Bridges' proposed trip to Honolulu, where longshoremen have been on strike since May 1. Judge Roche said he could go after the necessary papers are signed. Bridges' attorney, Norman Leonard, said Bridges would be in Hawaii in about three weeks.

Leonard stressed that Bridges wanted to confer with Chinese delegates at Marseilles and wanted to work actively with them in hope of reopening Chinese ports and restoring trade with this country.

Assistant U. S. Attorney Robert McMillan declared "the present regime of China is a Communist regime, and I think it is presumptuous of Mr. Bridges to consider such a thing at this time. It is not up to Mr. Bridges to concern himself with such matters."
