Berries Flavor Coffee Cake

 For a perfect summer breakfast serve quick coffee cake purple with fresh or frozen blueberries. The recipe given here achieves a fine texture and flavor with a combination of baking soda, sweet milk and vinegar.

Quick Coffee Cake
 Two cups sifted all-purpose flour, 2/3 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon baking soda, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/4 cup shortening, 1 egg, 1/2 cup milk, 1/4 cup vinegar, 1 1/2 cups fresh or frozen blueberries.

Sift flour, sugar, baking soda, salt and cinnamon together. Cut in shortening. Beat egg, milk and vinegar together. Add to flour mixture and stir until flour is dampened. Spread in greased 9-inch round baking dish 1 1/2 inches deep. Place blueberries on top of batter.

Crumb Topping
 One-half cup sugar, 4 tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 2 tablespoons soft butter or fortified margarine.

Mix ingredients for topping together and sprinkle over blueberries. Bake in moderately hot oven (400 degrees F.) about 30 minutes.

Truman's Anti-Depression Agenda Will Be Based On Prior Proposals

WASHINGTON, July 7—(AP)—President Truman's anti-depression program, due to reach Congress in his mid-year economic report Monday, will be built on proposals he made in January, officials predicted today.

They include federal loans to industry for expansion, drafting of a "fully formulated" set of public works plans, proposal for farm living standards, and broader coverage and bigger payments under the social security and jobless pay programs.

These were among the "reversible" features of the stabilization plan Mr. Truman submitted to the new Congress six months ago. They were observed at the time by the "anti-inflation" price, wage and allocation controls sought simultaneously.

Government officials as well as Legislators who have talked economics with Mr. Truman in recent weeks agreed in their private forecasts on the Presidential message, that these measures will be the framework of the new program. There may, of course, be other ones or new twists to the basic proposals.

Few officials would predict that Mr. Truman will abandon his proposal for tax-boosting; he might soften it, they said, and he already has stated—in the January report—that some excise taxes "should be repealed."

They expected a renewed call for a raise in the minimum wage from 40 cents an hour to 75 cents. It is considered likely too that

Oregon Defrauded in Refunds On Gasoline Taxes

SALEM, July 8.—(AP)—A big increase in fraudulent gasoline tax refunds was reported by the State Department yesterday.

The refunds are given to farmers and others who use gasoline for purposes other than driving on highways. For instance, the gasoline tax is refunded to farmers who use the fuel for farm operations.

William Healy, assistant secretary of state, said refunds last year amounted to 12.85 percent of the \$23,000,000 gasoline tax total. He said that the gas tax refund auditors are unable to check the fraudulent claims.

The favorite way to cheat the refund system is for farmers to use gasoline in their automobiles and then claim it was used in tractors.
