President Truman's anti-depression program, due to reach Congress in his midyear economic report Monday, will be built on proposals he made in January, officials predicted today.

They include federal loans to industry for expansion, drafting of a "fully formulated" set of public works plans, proposal for farm living standards, and broader coverage and bigger payments under the social security and jobless pay programs.

These were among the "reversible" features of the stabilization plan Mr. Truman submitted to the new Congress six months ago. They were obscured at the time by the "anti-inflation" price, wage and allocation controls sought simultaneously.






